1.Introduction

1.1 Background:

A dangerous condition or events that threaten or have the potential for causing injury to life or damage to property or the environment is called **Hazard**. Hazards can be categorised in many ways. But based on their origin, worldwide they are basically grouped in two broad headings:-

□ **Natural Hazard**: Hazards with Meteorological, geological or even biological origin.

☐ **Un-Natural Hazard**: Hazards with Human Caused or Technological origin.

It is also important to know that Natural Phenomena are extreme Climatological, Hydrological or Geological processes that do not pose any threat to human or property. For example, a massive earthquake in an unpopulated area is a natural phenomena but not a hazard. It is when these natural phenomena interact with human population or fragile areas which cases wide spread damage. The population which are prone to these natural phenomena are called **Vulnerable** to hazards.


A disaster is the output of a hazard such as earthquake, flood, landslide or cyclone coinciding with a vulnerable situation, which may include communities, cities or villages. Without vulnerability or hazard there is no disaster. A disaster happens when vulnerability and hazard meet.

India is a vast country and is prone to many hazards. In the meantime India has experienced the disaster like tsunami in 2008, great earthquakes like Assam-1950, Gujarat- 1992, Sikkim-2011, Super cyclones of Orissa, unexpected flash flood of Mumbai ect. Considering such situation Government of India already has passed the Disaster Management Act on 23rd December, 2005 in the Parliament. After this Act, disaster is no more confined to any particular department rather it is confined to all departments. This act enables the state government to form disaster management authority at the state level and make it more effective and specific.

Majuli-the largest river island of the world, is a riverine tract in the state of Assam. The island is located within the bounds of the Mighty Brahmaputra. It is a unique fluvial landform formed as a result of dynamic river system. The island is bound by river Brahmaputra in the South and river Subansiri in the North-West and the Kherkotia suti in the North-East. The total geographical area of Majuli district is 1,245.12 sq.k.m (9, 30,712 Bigha, 3 katha, 4 lessa) in the year of 1956-57, but having lost significantly to erosion it had an area of only 703.16 sq. k.m (5, 25,712 Bigha, 3 katha, 4 lessa) in 2017. The island has a length of about 80 K.M and 20-25 K.M width in North-South direction. There are many chapories around the

main mass of Majuli island which are also inherent parts of the Majuli. The chapories along with main land of Majuli district is highly prone to flood and erosion. The total no. of revenue villages in eighties was 210, but presently only 139 revenue villages exist, due to rampant erosion in last three decades.



1.2 Importance of multi hazard management plan:

Any kind of disaster is it man made or natural leads to immense loss of life including that of animal being and property. It causes serious disruption in the existing trend in the society and thereby causes serious social disorder. It poses severe threats to the developmental process of state or a country. Apprehending such kind of disaster a proper disaster preparedness and mitigation plan is very essential. Such a plan will not only help for disaster mitigation but at the same time it seeks to help in preventing some kind of disasters indeed. A meaningful developmental project or even a plan can then only sustain when it is people oriented i.e. a community based plan with every support from administration. A DISTRICT LEVEL DISASTER MANAGEMENT PLAN seeks to help in-

- Economizing of existing resources
- Quick and speedy response by administration as well as individuals

- Help us in understanding strength, weakness, opportunity and threat within the district and thereby help us in strategizing and implementing timely preparedness and mitigation activities

- Resources to be controlled and maximize
- Local resources utilization

1.3 The main features of multi-hazard plan are: -

- a. It gives importance to all the disasters equally and helps to mitigate the situation beforehand.
- b. All the departments are assigned with their proper role and responsibilities, which are clearly indicated in the SOPs.
- c. The District administration has to be alert round the year as disasters may occur anytime, anywhere in the district, irrespective of time and location.

1.4 Disaster Management Cycle:-

In multi-hazard response plan, the disaster management cycle has a significant role to play. The four stages of disaster cycle have their own importance in terms of their implementation during, after and before the occurrence of any disaster.

The Disaster Management Cycle:

1.5 Pre-Disaster or Risk Management Phase:-


Risk reduction activities, preparedness and mitigation come before disaster occurs. Preparedness and mitigation largely deals with the issues that reduce the risk of loss of life and property caused by the disasters by capacity building programmes. These activities take place during the normal time.

1.6 Post- Disaster or Crisis Management Phase:-

Response and recovery phases start after the occurrence of any disaster. Response basically deals with relief and rescue operations that take place immediately after disaster. Whereas, reconstruction and rehabilitation includes in recovery phase and continues immediately after relief and rescue operations, till the life of people becomes normal.

1.7. Necessity of the Plan:

Basic Concepts of Emergency Management suggests that the same management strategies can be applied to all emergencies. Emergencies do not just appear one day, rather they exist throughout the time and have a life-cycle of occurrence, and hence the management strategy should match the phases of an emergency in order to mitigate, prepare, respond and recover from its effect. There are four phases in Emergency Management: Mitigation, Preparedness, Response and Recovery. The four phases are visualized as having a circular relationship to each other (Emergency Management Cycle).



The activities in one phase may overlap those in the previous one. Hence the plan establishes an administrative structure for a systematic, co-ordinated and effective response at the district level. The purpose of the plan is to:-

- Ensure that the areas in district vulnerable to disasters are identified and measures for prevention and mitigation are undertaken by the department at the district level as well as by the local authorities promptly and effectively.
- Develop a system of coordination, collaboration and integrated approach at the district level.
- Identify the capacities of the responder agencies at the district level and assign functional responsibilities to each of them.
- Establish a central facility in the district, which enables all the responder agencies to interact and coordinate their efforts
- Suggest hazard specific preparedness, response and mitigation measures.
- Plan resource requirements and coordinate with the state government for requisitioning the need based resources.
- Provide an inventory of resources, key facilities and addresses for deployment and assistance towards preparedness and mitigation.
- Build the capacity of the responder agencies and communities for better preparedness and mitigation.

Considering the present global disaster scenario, the traditional disaster management that focused on crisis management has now given emphasis on risk management ensuring involvement of people and communities at every state and in each process.

1.8 Objectives of the plan:

The objectives behind the preparation of the District Disaster Management Plan is

- a) To mitigate impact of natural and man-made disasters through preparedness at District, Block and Village level.
- b) The District Disaster Management Plan (DDMP) helps to bring together the information related to equipments, skilled manpower and critical supplies available in the district.
- c) It helps to know the standard operating procedures of various departments at the time of disaster. The role and responsibility of each and every line department as well as the officers can be detected at the time of disaster.
- d) It helps the district administration to assess its own capacity in terms of available resources and get ready to mitigate any unexpected disaster effectively and to prevent the loss of human lives and property through preparedness, prevention & mitigation of disasters.
- e) To assist the line departments, block administration, communities in developing compatible skills for disaster preparedness and management.
- f) To disseminate factual information in a timely, accurate and tactful manner while maintaining necessary confidentiality.
- g) To develop immediate and long-term support plans for vulnerable people in/during disasters.

h) To have response system in place to face any eventuality.

Function of The District Disaster Management Plan:

2.1 Majuli- Administrative Profile :-

Majuli is a newly created District. It has population of about 2,17,858 nos. (Database collected from the Gaonburhas through a local census, 2023) As per 2011 Census it was 1,67,304 nos. It is bounded by North Lakhimpur District in the north and Jorhat in the south. Sivsagar district lies towards its east and Golaghat district lies toward its south-west. There are some villages of Majuli which are located around 70 km away from mainland and can be reached only via Golaghat district. Another islet called Sadhu Chapori is also part of Majuli district which is 142 km away in the river from district head quarter and can be reached via Lakhimpur District. Thus, although Majuli has less population, it is very widely spread across the river Brahmaputra.



2.2 Disasters

Flood and Erosion are two recurrent natural calamities in Majuli. However, there are other disasters such as Storm, Earth Quake which are less frequent yet have caused considerable damage to people and property in the past. Other disasters like Fire Accidents, Drowning, Boat Capsizing, Elephant depredation etc. are also common in Majuli where immediate rescue and relief operations are essential.

2.3 Flood

Flood is a perennial problem affecting people of Majuli every year during monsoon season. Majuli gets inundated not only in severe floods but also in normal flood cycles. Every year, at least three waves of floods affect Majuli with different intensities. The island has been experiencing floods for a long time as it is integral part of the active floodplain of River Brahmaputra. Floods here are associated with huge loss of life and property such as houses, crops etc., spread of epidemic, non-availability of essential commodities, artificial price-rise, nonavailability of sufficient medicines, drinking water etc. At times, schools, anganwadi centers, medical centers get completely inundated and are closed for days together. This causes huge direct and indirect loss to all sections of people. A severe flood can cause huge damage to many roads, bridges and culverts. Reconstruction of these flood damaged structures takes years together for sanction of fund and implementation to be complete. Often it leads to huge discontentment among people resulting in several law and order problems. The recent flood scenario reveals that nature of flooding, frequency, and extent of flood damage has been increasing over the years. Although flood is an integral part of life here, the untimely and severe floods in the recent years make the community highly vulnerable and less resilient compared to earlier days.




2.4 Erosion


VULNERABILITY MAPPING

Erosion is the most severe problem that affects Majuli. Since it is not considered as a natural disaster, no relief is prescribed under SDRF/NDRF guidelines except a compensation clause for loss of substantial portion of land caused by change of course of river. Unfortunately, families affected by erosion have tough time to cope with loss. Suddenly they lose entire agricultural land, homestead land. Due to flood, extensive erosion has been taking place in various sites of the island. Severe erosion has been occurring in areas like Kamalabari, Haldibari, Sonowal-Kacharigaon, Salmora, Kamargaon, Bessamera, Dakhinpat, Chumaimari, Kaniajan and Ahatguri due to flood water. Several Gaon Panchayats like Ahotguri, Dakhin Ahotguri of Majuli have lost school buildings and panchayat office building owing to severe erosion of Brahmaputra banks. Dozens of families have moved to embankment with makeshift structures. Every year these families are rehabilitated by giving alternate land. But presently there is no suitable land in Ahotguri, Dakhin Ahotguri Gaon Panchayats. Thus many families have started shifting towards Dergaon revenue circle of Golaghat district. These erosion affected families within Majuli have settled on either side of embankment in several places without basic amenities. There is a need for taking up projects phase-wise for construction of colonies for rehabilitation of such erosion-affected families. Such schemes may be taken up under NLCPR or

1/121294/2023 any other suitable funds. An effort is being made to construct raised platforms in low lying areas for rehabilitation of such families under MGNREGS.

2.5 Earth-Quake

The entire Brahmaputra basin is marked by numerous active faults because of which occurrence of earthquake in this region is very frequent. Some of the recent major Earthquakes of this region are Great Indian Earthquake of 1897 (8.7), Dhubri Earthquake of 1930 (7.0), Assam Earthquake of 1950 (8.6) and Indo-Burma Earthquake of 1988 (7.0). Earthquake in this region has a long-lasting impact as river flows through erodible formations. With a high-intensity Earth- Quake, the whole river course can get upset causing large-scale erosion; the river-bed may rise increasing the flood-proneness of this region. The Earthquake of 1950 majorly affected the upper Brahmaputra valley including Majuli. It was the most severe disaster causing tremendous changes in the riverine topography and sudden rise in the river bed. Such an upstream phenomenon was highly responsible for channel instability and severe floods downstream in the Dibrugarh-Nemati reach along Majuli. From this time Majuli island has come in to the grip of severe flood and erosion.

2.6 Cyclone

The bordoichila, a cyclonic wave from the Southwesterly monsoon hits the island and most parts of Assam. This uproots vegetation and often weakens structures. Traditionally the bamboo and cane ties are strengthened during this time, or new houses are constructed, thereby making the houses stronger to withstand the strong wind. Wide publicity on impending cyclone and advisory to take necessary measures in the rural areas usually helps in mitigating the damage. It is essential to assess the damage caused, immediately after such storm/cyclone to provide temporary relief as well as compensation for house damage, loss of livestock etc. During cyclone and storm, other accidents occur due to turbulence in the river. It is essential to warn people from plying in small boats in the river Brahmaputra during this period. If situation warrants, public ferry service may also need to be suspended until storm clears.

2.7 Boat-Capsizing

Although it cannot be called as natural disaster, as the only connectivity to the river island is through ferry service, it is likely to cause huge man-made disaster district Disaster Management Plan- Majuli | INTRODUCTION 11 if necessary safety measures are not followed. Although no such large-scale disaster took place in Majuli, such accidents have occurred elsewhere in Assam causing huge loss to human life. In 2012 April, a ferry carrying around 250 people capsized in Brahmaputra near Dhubri. 103 persons have lost their lives in this tragedy. Inland Water Transport Department is the supervising authority to ensure safety of the boats. There are several ferry ghats on Majuli Island. While some ghats are controlled by local bodies such as gaon panchayats, others are operated by IWT through lease system. Often, the ferry operators flout the safety guidelines and run ferries beyond optimum carrying capacity. These rules are codified in Control and Management of Ferries Rules 1968. Regular check on Ferries for compliance could avoid major accidents. Further, there is need for modernizing navigation system in these ferries by providing GPS and echosounders etc.

2.8 Fire and Drowning

Fire accidents and drowning of people who go to swim in the river Brahmaputra and its innumerable tributaries occur occasionally and need immediate rescue operations. Often these cases lead to breach of law and order depending on the circumstance. It is essential to appraise District Commissioner, Jorhat immediately in this regard whenever such accidents occur for necessary support.

2.9 Pandemic (COVID-19)

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) is an infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). It was first identified in December 2019 in Wuhan, Hubei, China, and has resulted in an ongoing coronavirus pandemic. On 5 October, the WHO said that one in ten people around the world (around 800 million) may have been infected with COVID-19. As of 14 October 2020, 38.1 million cases have been reported across 188 countries and territories with more than 1.08 million deaths; more than 26.4 million people have recovered.

Common symptoms include fever, cough, fatigue, shortness of breath or breathing difficulties, and loss of smell and taste. While most people have mild symptoms, some people develop acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS) possibly precipitated by cytokine storm, multi-organ failure, septic shock, and blood clots. The incubation period may range from one to fourteen days.

The first case of the COVID-19 pandemic in the Indian state of Assam was reported on 31 March 2020.

3 LEGAL FRAMEWORK

3.1 The Assam Relief Manual

The Assam Relief Manual 1976 outlines an integrated plan for relief administration. It incorporates executive instructions issued by the State Government from time to time to deal with emergency situation arising out of natural calamities, particularly floods. In this manual, the role of different authorities is clearly defined, emphasizing the role of co-ordinating authorities. The Flood Control Department, State Government of Assam through the Embankment and Drainage Act, 1953 published in 1954 is responsible for immediate protection to the island from erosion of Brahmaputra and implementing long term plans.

1/121294/2023 3.2 ASDMA

As mandated by Disaster Management Act 2005, the Government of Assam has adopted the act in 2006. The State Government has established the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) chaired by the Honorable Chief Minister, Assam with Hon'ble Minister Revenue and Disaster Management as its Vice Chairperson. To execute the mandate of the Authority the State Executive Committee with the Chief Secretary, Assam as its Chairperson has also been notified as per provision of the Disaster Management Act. ASDMA has notified the District Disaster Management Authority in all the 27 districts of Assam and placed officers for carrying out disaster management activities at the district. Assam has framed Disaster Management Policy and Disaster Management Rules in 2010 for providing the basic framework for the Disaster Management operations in the State.

3.3 State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF)

Norms are laid out for gratuitous Relief and assistance for different categories of damages caused by natural disasters by Disaster Management Division of Ministry of Home Affairs from time to time. Presently, the list of items and norms for assistance from SDRF and NDRF is accepted as per the recommendations of Thirteenth Finance Commission for the period of 2012-2015. The revised items and norms of assistance from the State Disaster Response Fund and the National Disaster Response Fund is attached as bellow.

The FFC has recommended three sub-windows of (i) Response & Relief, (ii) Recovery & Reconstruction; and (iii) Preparedness & Capacity Building, within SDRF and NDRF. Accordingly, the items and norms of expenditure have been divided in these 3 sub-windows. The approved list of items and norms for assistance from SDRF and NDRF in the wake of notified natural disasters is annexed (English and Hindi), which will be effective from the financial year 2022-23.

- (i) For assistance under NDRF for items at S. Nos. 2 (a), (b), 3 (a), (b), (c), 4 (a), (b), (c), 6 (ii), (iii), and 9, while actual expenditure is allowed, the State Government will provide the item-wise details of expenditure to the Inter-Ministerial Central Team (IMCT)/ Central Government.
- (ii) Ex-Gratia payment of Rs 50,000/- per deceased person, to next of kin of the deceased person, including those involved in the relief operations or associated in the preparedness activities, subject to the cause of death being certified as COVID-19, as per the guidelines jointly issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and the Indian Council of Medical Research on 3rd September, 2021, will be given as per guidelines on minimum relief issued by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) dated 11.09.2021.

This ex-gratia assistance will be applicable from the date of first COVID-19 case reported in the country and will continue till de-notification of COVID-19 as a disaster or till further orders, whichever is earlier, to next of kin of the deceased due to COVID-19.

- (iii) There will be a Mid-Term review of the norms after 2 years, based on price level index.
- (iv) The State Governments are to take utmost care and ensure that all individual beneficiary-oriented assistance is necessarily/ mandatorily disbursed through Direct Benefit Transfer in the bank account of the beneficiary.
- (v) The scale of relief assistance against each item for all notified disasters including 'local disaster' should not exceed the norms of SDRF/ NDRF. Any amount spent by the State for such disasters over and above the ceiling, would be borne out of the resources of the State Government and not from SDRF.

3.4 Water Resources Department:

This department is given responsibility to take up flood-protection works such as construction of embankments and their maintenance. They are also entrusted with setting up control room from 15th May to 15th October every year to report daily water level to sub-divisional officer for necessary action. Majuli Water Resource Division was established in 1987. It has entire Majuli district under its jurisdiction. It is headed by Executive Engineer, Water Resources whose head-quarter is in Garmur, Majuli.

3.5 Brahmaputra Board:

The Brahmaputra Board was set up by the Govt. of India under an Act of Parliament i.e., The Brahmaputra Board Act, 1980 under the present Ministry of Water Resources for the planning and integrated implementation of measures for the control of floods and bank erosion in the Brahmaputra Valley. The Board office started functioning with Head Quarters at Guwahati since 1982. The jurisdiction of the Board includes both the Brahmaputra and Barak Valleys. It is entrusted with the task of carrying out survey and investigations in Brahmaputra Valley and to prepare Master Plan for the control of floods, bank erosion and improvement of drainage in the Brahmaputra Valley and activities connected therewith. Accordingly, Brahmaputra Board has prepared master plans in three parts covering Brahmaputra Valley and Barak valley. The Master Plans envisage storage dams, embankments, anti-erosion measures, town protection works and schemes to prevent drainage congestion covering the flood- prone areas in the Northeast. Several Majuli specific studies are conducted by Brahmaputra Board and reports are published on Erosion Problem of Majuli Island. Based on the findings in these studies, several projects were taken up by the board such as the introduction of series of porcupine, dampeners in the form of RCC structure along the bank by Brahmaputra Board reduces the intensity and extent of bank erosion significantly. The present pro-siltation measures in the form of RCC porcupine adopted by Board gives satisfactory result in stabilizing the present river course.

4. RESPONSE PLAN

The onset of an emergency creates the need for time sensitive actions to save life and property, reduce hardships and suffering, and restore essential life support and community systems, to mitigate further damage or loss and provide the foundation for subsequent recovery. Effective response planning requires realistic identification of likely response functions, assignment of specific tasks to individual response agencies, identification of equipment, supplies and personnel required by the response agencies for performing the assigned tasks. A response plan essentially outlines the strategy and resources needed for search and rescue, evacuation, etc.

Considering all this points, this response plan has been developed. For the first time Incident Command System (ICS) has also been introduced in response plan along with the resource inventory. In fact, during disaster the ICS management tool will be more effective to handle the situation in proper way within limited time.

4.1 Response Structure during WarningStage

At district level, before the occurrence of disaster and immediately after the disaster, the district administration will alert the district control room so that proper information will be provided to the concerned authorities.

4.2 Incident Command System(ICS)

The Incident Command System (ICS) is a management system and an on-scene, all-risk, flexible modular system adaptable for natural as well as man-made disasters. The ICS has a number of attributes or system features. Because of these features, ICS has the flexibility and adaptability to be applied to a wide variety of incidents and events both large and small. The primary ICS management functions include:

Command
Operations
Logistics

- Planning
- ☐ Finance/Administration

The ICS seeks to strengthen the existing disaster response management system by ensuring that the designated controlling/responsible authorities at different levels are backed by trained Incident Command Teams (ICTs) whose members have been trained in the different facets of disaster response management.

4.3 The five command functions in the Incident Command System are as follows:

- 1. Incident Commander: The Incident Commander is responsible for all incident activity. Although other functions may be left unfilled, there will always be an Incident Commander.
- **2. OperationsSection:** Develops tactical organization and directs all the resources to carry out the Incident Action Plan
- **3.** PlanningSection: It is responsible for the collection, evaluation, and display of incident information, maintaining status of resources, and preparing the Incident Action Plan and incident related documentation.
- **4. LogisticsSection:** Provides resources and all other services needed to support the organization.
- **5. Finance / AdministrationSection:** Monitors costs related to the incident, provides accounting, procurement, time recording, cost analysis, and overall fiscal guidance.

4.3.1 Role and Responsibilities of ICSCommander-

The Incident commander's responsibility is the overall management of the incident. The Incident Commander may have a District who may be from the same agency, or from an assisting agency. Following are the responsibility of the IncidentCommander---


- Assess the situation and obtain a briefing from the prior IncidentCommander.
- Determine Incident Objectives &Strategy.
- Establish the immediate priorities.
- Establish the Immediate CommandPost.
- Establish the appropriateorganization.
- Assure planning meeting are scheduled asrequired.
- Approved and authorized the implementation of a Incident ActionPlan.
- Ensure that adequate Safety measures are inplace.
- Co-ordinate activity for all Command & GeneralStaff.
- Co-ordinate with key People&Officials.
- Approved request for additional resources or for the release of resources.
- Key agency administrator informed the incidentStatus.
- Approved the use of student volunteer& auxiliarypersonal.
- Order the demobilization of theincident

4.4 District Level Incident Response

At the district level, there will be one District Headquarters Team with the primary function of assisting the District Commissioner in handling tasks like general co-ordination, distribution of relief materials, media management and the overall logistics. Suitable officers from the district administration will be carefully

selected and professionally trained for the different ICS positions inorder to constitute the District Level Incident Command Teams. (DICTs). The teams will focus on the operational aspects of response management, duly supported by other functions in ICS, e.g. Planning, Logistics, Finance/Administration, etc. The officers drawn for this assignment will be carefully selected by the District Commissioner depending upon their fitness, ability and aptitude for any of the DICT positions and they will be professionally trained to fulfil their assigned roles. Arrangements will also be made for ensuring their mobilization in a time-bound manner for their deployment to the trouble spot. Due consideration for the appropriate level of seniority will be given while constituting the teams. The team personnel may be selected from the General Administration/ Revenue Department which traditionally handles disaster response, the option to pick up willing and capable personnel from any other department for taking up specific positions in the DICT will be left open. For some positions, a suitable number of additional personnel will be trained as reserve for taking care of contingencies like transfers, promotions, etc.

For the position of the Incident commander, a suitable officer of the rank of Additional District Commissioner will be preferred if District Commissioner feel so. The District Level Incident Command Teams will function under the overall control of District Commissioner. The State governments can also deploy the DICTs to other districts depending upon the magnitude of the disaster.



4.5. District Relief Committee:

District Commissioner co-ordinates all the relief activities in the district as per Assam Relief Manual. A standing district Relief Committee on natural calamities is formed comprising the following members.

- 1. District Commissioner Chairperson
- 2. District level officers of the departments directly concerned with relief operations as members.
- 3. Local member of Legislative Assembly Member

FUNCTIONS:

To organize and render relief in accordance with the provisions of the relief manual and detailed instructions issued from time to time. To co-ordinate effort of Government departments and non-Government organizations in connection with relief operation; To suggest measures for improvement in relief measures and To advise on any other measures necessary for relief operation.

PRE-FLOOD MEASURES:

District Relief Committee Meeting is to be held by 15th February every year to make a contingency plan for ensuing flood season

- 1. Maximum number of relief camps likely to be set up and survey of suitable locations to set up relief shelters.
- 2. The manner in which individuals and voluntary organizations are to be associated with relief teams.
- 3. The manner in which Gaon Panchayats will be associated with relief operations.
- 4. Works to be taken up under several line departments such as repairs of roads, embankments etc.
- 5. Estimation of quantity of relief items that might be required and sending proposals for concerned authorities to provide the same.
- 6. Preparation of contingency plan.
- 7. To update list of jeeps, buses, boats, mar-boats, trucks and other vehicles necessary for relief operation.
- 8. To obtain Gaon Panchayat wise population duly signed by Gaon Panchayat President and Secretary.

POST-FLOOD MEASURES:

To assess the flood damage by all the departments;

- 1. To collect agricultural statistics from Sub divisional Agricultural Officer about acreage of crops affected by flood, damage to crops and farm families affected.
- 2. To report on losses and damages in each sub-division to be submitted immediately to the Revenue Department through District Commissioner after the flood water recedes.
- 3. Assessment of losses to houses through Circle Officer
- 4. Assessment of losses to fisheries, handloom sector, animal husbandry through respective departments.
- 5. Make assessment of the requirement and arrangement for distribution of
- a. Seeds and seedlings as grants-in-aid.
- b. Agricultural loans in cash and kind.
- c. Rehabilitation of persons uprooted by erosion. Provide them alternate lands for homestead in the nearby areas.
- d. Request Revenue Department through District Commissioner for suspension or remission of land revenue depending on severity of calamity in accordance with provisions of Assam Land Revenue Manual.
- e. To send reports to the Government both when relief works are started and closed. For this purpose, it is essential to collect photographs before beginning the works and after completion of works.

PRE-DISASTER

- 1. Ensure that communication equipment is in working order.
- 2. Keep an emergency contact directory with all relevant numbers.
- 3. Carry a hazard map demarcating the most vulnerable/safe areas and households

ON RECEIPT OF WARNING

- 1. Instruct the public to listen to the radio.
- 2. Pay attention to local warnings and their interpretation.
- 3. Crosscheck the warning received on radio, with the nearest control room
- 4. Disseminate the warning, safety tips using megaphones/mikes sirens etc., door-to-door.
- 5. Dissemination of information on suspension of ferry service.

DURING DISASTER

1. Remain in the safe shelters and provide the evacuees with regular updates

AFTER A DISASTER

- 1. Get the de-warning from Sub-Divisional Control Room and announce the same
- 2. Disseminate precautionary information on post disaster health hazards and remedies.
- 3. Give immediate assessment to concerned authorities on damage, casualty etc.
- 4. Guide the search and rescue team with geographic information

4.7. Safety tips to be disseminated to public:-

IMPORTANT SAFETY TIPS TO PUBLIC.

BEFORE FLOOD

- 1. All the family members should know the safe route to nearest shelter/raised pucca house.
- 2. Have an emergency kit on hand which includes a:
- i A portable radio, torch and spare batteries;
- ii Stocks of fresh water, dry food (chura, mudi, gur, biscuits),

kerosene, candle and matchboxes;

iii Waterproof or polythene bags for clothing and valuables, an

umbrella and bamboo stick (to protect from snake), salt and sugar.

iv A first aid kit, manual and strong ropes for tying things

WHEN YOU HEAR A FLOOD WARNING OR IF FLOODING APPEARS LIKELY

- 1. Tune to your local radio/TV for warnings and advice.
- 2. Keep vigil on flood warning given by local authorities
- 3. Don't give any importance to rumours and don't panic
- 4. Keep dry food, drinking water and clothes ready
- 5. Prepare to take bullock carts, other agricultural equipments, and domestic animals to safer places or to higher locations.
- 6. Plan which indoor items you will raise or empty if water threatens to enter your house

7. Check your emergency kit

DURING FLOODS

- 1. Drink boiled water.
- 2. Keep your food covered, don't take heavy meals.
- 3. Use raw tea, rice-water, tender coconut-water, etc. during diarrhoea; contact your ANM/AWW for ORS and treatment.
- 4. Do not let children remain on empty stomach.
- 5. Use bleaching powder and lime to disinfect the surrounding.
- 6. Help the officials/volunteers distributing relief materials.

IF YOU NEED TO EVACUATE

- 1. Firstly pack warm clothing, essential medication, valuables, personal papers, etc. in waterproof bags, to be taken with your emergency kit.
- 2. Take the emergency kit
- 3. Inform the local volunteers (if available), the address of the place you are evacuating to.
- 4. Raise furniture, clothing and valuables onto beds, tables and to the top of the roof (electrical items highest).
- 5. Turn off power.
- 6. Whether you leave or stay, put sandbags in the toilet bowl and over all laundry / bathroom drain-holes to prevent sewage back-flow.
- 7. Lock your home and take recommended/known evacuation routes.
- 8. Do not get into water of unknown depth and current.

IF YOU STAY OR ON YOUR RETURN

- 1. Stay tuned to local radio for updated advice.
- 2. Do not allow children to play in, or near, flood waters.
- 3. Avoid entering floodwaters. If you must, wear proper protection for your feet and check depth and current with a stick. Stay away from drains, culverts and water over knee-deep.
- 4. Do not use electrical appliances, which have been in floodwater until checked for safety.
- 5. Do not eat food, which has been in floodwaters.
- 6. Store tube well water in plastic jars or use halogen tablets before drinking.
- 7. Be careful of snakes, snakebites are common during floods.

- 3. Distribute basic medicines and demonstrate their use.
- 4. To keep stretchers/local alternatives made of bamboo ready to carry injured people

ON RECEIPT OF WARNING

- 1. Ensure that contents of all First Aid kits are satisfactory.
- 2. Move into the safe shelter.

POST-DISASTER

- 2. Counsel the traumatized people
- 3. Listen to and calm the victims affectionately and patiently

Pre-Disaster Preparedness Activities

- 1. Ensure sufficient supply of chlorine tablets etc. for disinfecting drinking water sources.
- 2. Ensure sufficient stocks of lime powder for disinfecting large water bodies.
- 3. Ensure that sufficient water is stored in proper tanks and jerry cans in safe shelters.
- 4. Ensure that there is list of contact persons for assistance.
- 5. Raise prior awareness amongst the community about how to treat water sources.
- 6. Set a minimum standard in advance for distribution of water in emergency.
- 7. Prepare list of hand tube wells constructed in raised platforms and make sure that people in that locality use these sources.
- 8. Keep mobile water treatment plant in working condition. Perform regular maintenance and repair works before flood season.

ON RECEIPT OF WARNING

- 1. Assess the drinking water supply and available water resources
- 2. Organize for alternate power supply by procuring generators/diesel engines
- 3. Ensure that the sanitation facilities at the safe shelter are in working order.

POST DISASTER

- 1. Disinfect all the Water Sources, Tanks and HTWs.
- 2. Keep the mobile water treatment plant in areas where no pure drinking water is available.
- 3. Disinfect large water bodies with lime powder
- 4. Coordinate with the Sanitary Inspectors for taking drinking water samples
- 5. Ensure that no area is left un-serviced.
- 6. Ensure that sufficient water is available in bathing units and toilets at relief camps
- 7. Demarcate areas for safe excreta disposal around the relief camp
- 8. Guide the local authorities to construct latrines away from groundwater sources.
- 9. Spray bleaching powder and other disinfectants to prevent infectious disease
- 10. Ensure that solid waste is put in refuse containers or buried in a refuse pit
- 11. Ensure that there are no medical wastes such as needles, drugs etc. lying around
- 12. Co-ordinate with the first aid team to inoculate against water borne diseases
- 13. Construct temporary soak pits for onsite disposal of wastewater.

PRE-DISASTER:

- 1. Familiarize with damage and needs assessment formats
- 2. Assess the estimated need of relief materials
- 3. Mobilize stocks of food grains and medicines from government, NGOs, etc.
- 4. Stocks materials like ropes, bamboos, tarpaulin etc in the safe shelter identified
- 5. Keep a record of the stock available and maintain and dispatch them as required.

- 6. Prioritize the elderly persons, pregnant women, children etc.
- 7. Maintain a list of the households receiving assistance.
- 8. Make a physical inventory of stocks when external assistance arrives.
- 9. Work closely with the communication group to stay in touch with control room
- 10. Organize a meeting to evaluate the experience, internalize learning
- 11. Keep the undistributed relief material in a safe place and preserve it

The Joint Director (Health) is required to prepare the contingency plan before every flood season with details of Health Control Room, Health Camps, and duty-charts etc. He shall co-ordinate with Relief Branch of District Commissioners Office for providing machine boats necessary for flood relief camps at char areas. i.e., Kartic Chapori, Sadhu Chapori, Daboli Chapori etc. ANM of sub-center will be responsible for any epidemic relief duty within the jurisdiction. Whenever situation arises, he should be in a position to dispatch reasonable numbers of doctors, Para medical staff, medicines and other equipment to the site of occurrence of disaster whether it is flood or any other natural calamity e.g. earthquake, cloud-burst, storm etc. It is also necessary that he should have sufficient medicines in stock that should be available all the time. Lifesaving drugs should be utilized and replenished on and on.

5.2.1 Prevention Activities:

- 1. Assess preparedness levels at District and Block levels.
- 2. Prepare a list of hospitals, PHCs, CHCs, dispensaries and other institutions located in the area.
- 3. Prepare list of doctors and Para-medical staff already available in each of the areas and the number of additional hands of each category that may be required in each of the areas in case of severe emergency.
- 4. Prepare list of doctors and Para-medical staffs of different category who can be withdrawn from their places of work and their services utilized for emergency relief work.
- 5. Ensure that adequate stock of medicines, vaccines and disinfectants likely to be necessary are kept at the district and sub-divisional headquarters.
- 6. Keep ready materials for augmenting the hospital beds by at least 10 in case of necessity and opening one camp dispensary for each of the very vulnerable areas.
- 7. Arrange for mobilizing at short notice two medical relief teams at the district HQ so as to rush them for relief work.

- 8. Prepare a detailed plan for utilizing the doctors and other voluntary organizations in the district if so required.
- 9. Take measures for prevention of epidemic and arrange vaccinations against small pox, cholera, typhoid etc. of the people in these areas.
- 10. Identification of areas endemic to epidemics and natural disasters.
- 11. Identification of appropriate locations for testing laboratories.
- 12. Listing and networking with private health facilities.
- 13. Strengthening of disease surveillance, ensuring regular reporting from the field level workers (ANMs/LHV etc.) and its compilation and analysis at the PHC and District levels, on a weekly basis (daily basis in case of an epidemic or during natural disasters), forwarding the same to the State Disease Surveillance Cell and monthly feedback from the State to the Goalpara district and from the District to the PHC.
 - Formation of adequate number of mobile units with trained personnel, testing facilities, communication systems and emergency treatment facilities.
 - Identification of locations in probable disaster sites for emergency operation camps.
 - Awareness generation about various infectious diseases and their prevention.
 - Training and IEC activities
 - Training of field personnel, Traditional Birth Attendants, community leaders, volunteers, NGOs and CBOs in first aid, measures to be taken to control outbreak of epidemics during and after a disaster, etc.
 - Arrangement of standby generators for every hospital.
 - Listing of vehicles, repair of departmental vehicles that will be requisitioned during emergencies for transport of injured.
 - Vector Control programme as a part of overall community sanitation activities.
 - Surveillance and spraying of water bodies for control of malaria.
 - Promoting and strengthening Primary Health Centres with network of Para professionals to improve the capacity of surveillance and control of epidemics.
 - Establishing testing laboratories at appropriate locations to reduce the time taken for early diagnosis and subsequent warning.
 - Establishing procedures and methods of coordination with the local authorities/departments and NGOs to ensure that adequate prevention and preparedness measures have been taken to prevent and / or minimise the probable outbreak of epidemics.
 - Identification of areas prone to certain epidemics and assessment of requirements to control and ultimately eradicate the epidemic.
 - Identification of appropriate locations and setting up of site operation camps for combating epidemics.
 - Provision in each hospital for receiving large number of injured persons at a time.

5.2.2 Response Activities:

- Alert sub-ordinate officers and staff for emergency on receipt of warning.
- Check vehicles, equipment, stores etc. and draw up tentative programme of action.
- Immediately visit the affected areas along with one medical relief team.
- Start measures for health relief in an institution located conveniently in the affected area.
- Make immediate arrangements to open additional camp dispensaries, if necessary.

- Utilize the services of Red Cross and other Volunteer Organizations.
- Frequently visit the affected areas and ensure effectiveness of health measures.
- Decide immediately on isolation of certain patients if necessary and arrange for isolation wards.
- Strengthening of drug supply system.
- Situational assessment and reviewing the status of response mechanisms in known vulnerable pockets.
- Ensure adequate availability of personnel in disaster sites.
- Review and update precautionary measures & procedures and apprise the personnel who will be implementing those.
- Disinfections of water bodies and drinking water sources.
- Immunization against infectious diseases.
- Ensure continuous flow of information.

5.2.3. Recovery Activities:

- Continuation of disease surveillance and monitoring.
- Continuation of treatment, monitoring and other epidemic control activities till the situation are brought under control and the epidemic eradicated.
- Trauma counselling.
- Treatment and socio-medical rehabilitation of injured or disabled persons.
- Immunisation and nutritional surveillance.
- Long term plans to progressively reduce various factors that contribute to high level of vulnerability to diseases of population affected by disasters.
- Restore equipment and stores.
- Repair or replace damaged equipment.
- Arrange for disposal of unutilized medicines and disinfectants.

5.3 Public Distribution System:

As of now, Majuli does not have government owned grain storage space. This creates problem if huge amount of relief material is to be transported

6. Standard operating Procedures :-

6.1 Standard Operating Procedures of the Line Departments:

6.2 Revenue Department

A. Normal Time Activities

A map of disaster prone areas in the district, history of the district, geographical conditions occupational details, settlements, rain, irrigation and industries etc. Safe alternative routes to utilize during disaster in the disaster prone areas. List of key officers of all the departments, staff, vehicles and buildings. Details of control room arrangement. Details of food grain storage places in the district and the Fair Price Shops. Details of vehicles, boats and equipments available in the district for rescue operation. Setting up of communication to communicate the messages from village to village. List of NGOs and self-help groups and their addresses and phone numbers in the circle. Orientation Training to various District level officers and departments for effective functioning of control room, co-ordinations and operations. Hazard analysis, seasons, and possibilities of disasters and review of disaster history. Review of disaster prone areas, risks, response plan, resource and utility of resources. To update the DDMP. To check the condition of safe shelter during his visits in the district places and if necessary gets it repaired by co-coordinating with the local authorities, available financial resources and voluntary organizations. Repairing of roads and ways leading to safe shelters by co-ordinating with various development plans/schemes. To co-ordinate scheme for poverty eradication, self-employment and the development schemes of other departments.

B. On receiving the warning

Assigning the work as to what to be done by which officer in case the disaster hits.

- Will review and have co-ordination task.
- Will alert and activate the functionaries related to early warning and communication looking to the possibilities of
- disaster and will see that the messages are intimated to all concerned.
- Will send the vehicles with mikes and sound system for the areas of top priorities.
- Will instruct all the staff to remain present at their respective places. Shifting the people living in low lying areas,
- seashores, economically weaker people socially and economically backward families and houseless families to
- safe places.

(C) Post disaster activities

- Will segregate the villagers and areas victimized by the disaster and activate the DMTs.
- Will guide the team members about the payments of relief accident to damage as per the rules and policies of the
- government before the start of duty.
- Will make arrangements for the transportation and distribution of Govt. relief amount and materials.
- Will make due arrangements to see that there should be no haphazard distribution of relief material so that needy
- people are not deprived of it.
- Will arrange for drinking water and essential things at community kitchen / relief camps as per the necessity.
- Will work out the primary estimates of the damage.
- Will undertake the rescue operations to save the trapped people through DMTs trained police personnel and
- swimmers on need base.
- Will requisite more vehicles for rescue work, shifting the people to temporary/permanent dispensary for treatment
- through DMTs, Home Guards, Local Police, Para Military Forces etc.
- Will arrange for identification of the people, who died, maintain the dead bodies till legal procedure is over.

6.3 Police Department

A. Normal Time Activities

The Superintendent of Police will co-ordinate the work of disaster management as nodal officer. He will prepare a separate and comprehensive plan of district regarding the department of police and also prepare details of resources as a part of DDMP. He will consider the following in it. Details of contacts of all the staff members under the district. Maps and statistical data of district areas. Resources and human resources useful at the time of disaster. Details of police staff and retired officers/staff of the police and the control room. Details of functions of staff of the district control room. Appointment of the nodal officer in the control room. Details of anti-social elements. Immediate police procedures for human death. Adequate equipments for communication. List of swimmers and other skilled persons. Wireless stations in the district and communication network. To update the related details of Disaster Management Plan. Identification of all vulnerable places, building, market place ect. Training for Police, HG, VDPs and proper briefing on search & rescue and first aid.

(B)On receiving the warning:

Evacuation of public from low lying area on receipt of flood warning. Quick dissemination of information. Traffic management in the roads to the affected area. Security of property and maintenance of law and order in the affected area. Supplement resource from HG and VDPs for search & rescue and evacuation activities. To ensure enforcement of essential commodity act. A joint control room of all the forces would be set up for better co-ordination among various security agencies. In case of IED blast bombs disposal squad would be kept ready and put into operation whenever necessary. As the first responder police would rush to the site of the explosion immediately on getting the information and access the situation and send information to the higher authority. Earmarking of areas where blast had taken place and special action plan of dividing such areas into zones and deployment of manpower in those areas. Chemical and biological weapons are referred to as 'The Poor Man's Atomic Bomb'. Protection against some of the infections occurred by chemical & biological weapons can be achieved by advance immunization and other medical procedures.

(C)Post Disaster activities:

Will arrange law and order against theft in the disaster affected area. Will co-ordinate the search and rescue operation and all other assistance to the affected people in case of earthquake & flood. Will arrange for security at the relief camps/relief materials storages. Will see the law and order is maintained at the time of distribution of relief material. Will assist the

authorities for evacuation of people to the safer places. Will make due arrangements for post mortem of dead persons, and legal procedure for speedy disposal and regular updation of the list of missing and dead person. Take video / Photograph of the death, casualties caused by disaster. Call for a re-enforcement for materials required for rescue operations.

6.4 Health Department:

A. Normal Time Activities

While preparing the DDMP / updating the same, the health department shall take care to include the following particulars carefully. A separate plan for disaster management regarding health. Arrangements for exchange of information in the control room. Appointment of nodal officer. Advance arrangements for life saving medicines, insecticides and vaccines. Maintenance of vehicles such as ambulance and other equipments such as generators etc. Distribution of work by forming groups of staff during emergency. List of private practicing doctors / medical facilities. Arrangement for survey of disaster. Mobile dispensary units. Information regarding proper places for on the spot medical services in various village during disaster. Dissemination of information among the people regarding the death, injury. Primary information of disaster related relief activities to all the staff members. Training to PHC / Community Health Centre staff to prevent spreading of diseases among the people, animals, and advance planning for the same. Blood group wise list of blood donors with contact telephone numbers and addresses. Training of DMTs regarding first aid. To prepare an action plan for the availability of equipments to be useful at the time of disaster management for medical treatment. Co-ordination with various government agencies—schemes to meet the necessity of equipments in emergency. To see that all vehicles like ambulance, jeep and equipments like generators and equipments essential for health care are in working condition.

(B)On receipt of warning:

Will ensure the availability of important medicines, lifesaving medicines, insecticides and if necessary contact for additional supply. Round the clock control room at the district level. Will send the health staff for duty in their areas as per the plan of disaster management. Activate the mobile health units for the post disaster situation. Will organize in advance to mobilize the local doctors and local voluntary agency for emergency work. Will contact the blood donors for blood donation, on the basis of lists prepared.

(C) Post Disaster Activities:

Provide first aid to the injured and shifting of seriously injured people to the nearby hospital. Send sufficient stock of medicines to the affected areas immediately.

- Will make arrangements for the available additional health staff in the affected areas deputed by the state authority.
- Will organize to get the insecticides to prevent spreading of diseases.
- Will ensure the purity of drinking water by testing the sources of water.
- Will depute the mobile units for first aid.
- Distribution of chlorine tablets and other necessary medicines from house to house.
- Will shift the seriously injured people to the hospital.
- Will immediately start the procedure for post mortem of the dead persons as per the rules.

6.5 Public Health Engineering Department:

A. Normal time activities

The water supply dept. shall ensure the following to be included in the DDMP:-

Setting up of control room and arrangement for the control room operator. Assign the responsibility as nodal officer to the Executive Engineer or any other officer. Prepare an alternative contingency plan to provide drinking water in case of failure of regular water distribution system during disaster. Detailed information of available water resources throughout the district. Arrangement of Govt. or private tankers to provide water temporary and immediately. Preventive measures for water borne diseases and chlorination of water. Availability of safe drinking water in the affected areas. Inform the staff about the disaster.

(B) On receiving Warning:

Organize the teams to check the sources of water / drinking water. Standby arrangements of tankers for drinking water through tankers or any other available source. Will make available chlorine tablets in sufficient quantity and arrange to distribute through DMTs.

(C)Post Disaster activities:

- Implement the alternative contingency plan to provide drinking water in case of failure of regular water distribution systems during disaster. Will start work for immediate repairing of water pipes in case of damage.
- Will arrange to check the water tanks, overhead tanks, and pumps, reservoirs and other water resources.
- Will contact the electricity authorities to re-establish the electric supply in case of failure.
- Will provide chlorinated water either by activating group water supply schemes individual schemes or through tankers. Will provide drinking water to the relief camps / relief kitchens, shelters etc. through available resources.

6.6 Agriculture Department:

(A) Normal time activities:

All the details of his subordinate staff with addresses and phone numbers and resources of irrigation for agriculture in all the villages. Details of buildings, vehicles and equipments under his control and list of contractors with vehicles and equipments used by them. Details regarding agricultural production, extension, seed growth centres, agriculture university campus, training centres ect; Action plan regarding the repair/alternative arrangement in case of agricultural production related facilities are disrupted.

- Will inspect the sub-ordinate offices, other centres and sub-centres under his control, which are damage prone.
- Will prepare a sub-plan for timely and speedy availability of machines and equipments to restoration of the economic activities in case of loss of property and crop.
- Will maintain the departmental equipments such as diesel generators, dumpers, generator, cutters, tree cutters, ladders, ropes, flood lights, shovels, axes, hammers, RCC cutters, cable wires, fire equipments, de-dusting equipments ect; which can be used during emergency and ensure every 3 months those are in working condition.
- Will prepare a list of public properties related to agriculture in the damage prone areas and will in advance make arrangements to lessen the damage. Will take due care to see that the emergency services at hospital, shelters, with special reference to agriculture are not disrupted.

(B) On receipt of warning:

- Will immediately contact the District Control Room and will assist in the work assigned to him as a part of his duty.
- Will ensure that the staffs under this control are on duty at the headquarters.
- Will assign the work to his subordinate officers and staff the work to be done regarding agriculture under DDMP and will send them to their sites.
- Will ensure the availability of resources included in the DDMP and will make due arrangement to get those during emergency.
- Will make groups having vehicles for emergency work and will assign the areas to them.
- Will set up a temporary Control Room for the dissemination of information for emergency work and will appoint a nodal officer.

(C)Post Disaster activities:

- Will deploy the resources and manpower available to manage the disaster.
- Will send DMTs with necessary equipments in case the crop is washed away, and if there is water logging in a very large amount.
- Will act in such a way that the human life is restored again speedily and timely in the priority areas.
- Will contact the circle office or central control room if machines equipments, vehicles, man power, technical personnel are required to restore the agricultural activities.
- Will make arrangement to avail the external helps to manage to disaster.
- Will collect the details of loss of crops to send it to the district administration. Should have the details of village wise various crops in the district.
- Will prepare a primary survey report of crop damage in the area and will send the same to district control room and also to the administrative head.

6.7 Public Works Department

A. Normal time activities

- Details of the staff members with their contact addresses and telephone numbers.
- Details of buildings, vehicles and equipment as well as the names of contractors and the vehicles & equipment used by them. Maps of the areas in the district with the statistical data related to available resources.

- The position of approach roads and other road of all the villages including bridges, railway crossing etc.
- To strictly observe the rules during the constructions regarding earthquake and cyclone proof materials.
- The PWD will inspect periodically the buildings, residences, high rise buildings under their control.Damage prone road bridges and arrangement for their inspections, action plan for emergency repairs.
- Will appoint an officer of the rank of Assistant Engineer to coordinate during emergency at the District Control Room.
- Will maintain the departmental equipments such as bulldozers, tractors, water tankers, dumpers, earthmovers excavator, de-watering pumps, generators, cutters, tree cutters, ladders, ropes, flood lights, shovels, axes, hammers, RCC cutters ect; which can be used during emergency and will quarterly check-up these to ensure in working condition.

(B) On receipt of warning:

- Will immediately contact the District Control Room for assistance.
- Will ensure that all the staff members remain on duty at the headquarters.
- Will send the officers and the staff assigning them specific duties for the DDMP Undertake all the action for the disaster management required to be done by the department.

(C)Post Disaster Activities:

- Will remain active for search and rescue activities
- Will provide all the available resources and manpower for disaster management.
- Will mobilize the service of technical personnel for the damage survey work to help the district administration
- Will prepare a primary report of damage in the affected area within
- Will make arrangements for electricity, water, and sanitation in the temporary shelters. Will also inspect the approach roads leading to the temporary shelter and repair the same if so required.

6.8 Forest Department:

A. Normal time activities

- Addresses of members with telephone numbers. Details of veterinary centres, artificial insemination centres, veterinary dispensary, veterinary colleges buildings, vehicles, mobile dispensaries and equipments under his control and also the details of vehicles and equipments used often by outsource. Maps showing the details of area with statistical data. Approach roads under forest department and their condition including bridges, railway crossing etc.
- To inspect periodically the buildings, residences under forest department
- To maintain the equipments available such as sharp instruments, insecticides, diesel generators, dumpers, generator, cutters, tree cutters, ladders, ropes, flood lights, shovels, axes, hammers, RCC cutters, cable wires, fire equipments, de-dusting equipments etc; which can be used during emergency and will also ensure that they are in working condition.
- To take care of public shelters, other places to be used for evacuation with primary facilities like water
- To prepare a list of public properties in the damage prone forest areas and will make advance arrangements to lessen the damage.

(B)On Receiving the Warning

- To immediately contact the district control room and will assist in the work.
- To ensure that the staff at the headquarter is on duty.
- To assign the work to be done by the subordinate officers and staff regarding transportation under DDMP and to send them to their sites.
- To arrange for wireless, telephones, manpower, forest guard in advance to disseminate information of the disaster in the damage prone areas and will play a key role with the district administration to warn the public.
- To make in advance arrangement for fuel wood and bamboos, gravels for priority areas.

• (C)Post Disaster Activities:

- To follow the instructions of District Disaster Management Authority.
- To carry out the duty assigned for search and rescue work.
- To engage the resources and manpower available to manage the disaster.
- To prepare a primary report of damage for the affected areas.
- To take actions to provide electricity, water and sanitation to the temporary shelters in the forest areas.
- To send task forces with vehicles, tree cutters, ropes, flood light, generator in case of closure of roads due to felling of trees.

6.9 Electricity Department:

Electricity department shall ensure to restore uninterrupted power supply to the affected areas in case of disaster taking place and will have all the information available with him as to the manpower and materials at his disposal in the district.

(A)Prevention Activities:

Identification of materials/tool kits required for emergency response. Ensure and educate the minimum safety standards to be adopted for electrical installation and equipments and organize training of electricians accordingly. Develop and administer regulations to ensure safety of electrical accessories and electrical installations. Train and have a contingency plan to ensure early electricity supply to essential services during emergencies and restoration of electric supply at an early date. Develop and administer code of practice for power line clearance to avoid electrocution due to broken / fallen wires. Strengthen high-tension cable towers to withstand high wind speed, flooding and earthquake, modernise electric installation, strengthen electric distribution system to ensure minimum damages during natural calamities. Conduct public/industry awareness campaigns to prevent electric accidents during normal times and during and after a natural disaster.

(B) Response Activities:

Disconnect electricity after receipt of warning. Attend sites of electrical accidents and assist in undertaking damage assessment. Stand-by arrangements to ensure temporary electricity supply. Inspection and repair of high tension lines /substations/transformers/poles etc. Ensure the public and other agencies are safeguarded from any hazards, which may have occurred because of damage to electricity distribution systems.

6.10 District Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs:

(A) Prevention Activities:

Construction and maintenance of storage godowns at strategic locations. Stock piling of food and essential commodities in anticipation of disaster. Take appropriate preservative methods to ensure that food and other relief stock are not damaged during storage, especially precautions against moisture, rodents and fungus infestation.

(B) Response Activities:

Management of procurement.

Management of material movement.

Inventory management

6.11Telecommunication Department:

The Telecom District Manager (BSNL) shall make sincere efforts to restore telecommunication services in the affected areas immediately, so that there is no communication gap and he shall put all his available manpower and machinery to use for restoration of communication services without delay.

6.12 Transport (District Transport Officer):

The District Transport Officer is required to provide transportation facilities for the evacuation purposes and shall have a contingent plan with respect to district monitoring the availability of buses, cranes etc. along with locations.

(A) Prevention Activities:

- Listing of vehicles that can be used for emergency operation. Safety accreditation, enforcement and compliance.
- Ensuring vehicles follow accepted safety standards. Build awareness on road safety and traffic rules through awareness campaign, use of different IEC strategies and training to school children. Ensure proper enforcement of safety regulations Response Activities. Requisition vehicles, trucks, and other means of transport to help in the emergency operations. Participate in post impact assessment of emergency situation. Support in search, rescue and first aid.

(B)Response Activities:

• Provision of personal support services e.g. counselling. Supporting the administration in development of storage and in playing a key role and in the coordination of management and distribution of relief and rehabilitation Materials. Supportive role in reconstruction and recovery activities.

6.13 A.H. & Veterinary Department:

(A) Prevention Activities:

Assess requirement of veterinary measures to be taken in affected areas and arrange for VAS, VFA and other staff, equipment, medicines, Vaccines, disinfectants etc., materials for opening first aid centres and camp dispensaries. Locate suitable high places for sheltering livestock. Mobilize two or more veterinary teams at the district HQ for emergency relief work. Keep at prescribed scales or essential equipment, medicines, vaccines, disinfectants in every hospital, dispensary, first aid centre in the affected areas. Arrange for fodder from livestock fodder farms or from other sources. Arrange for prevention of wide spread decease in epidemic form amongst animals. Assist the district administration in arranging with local traders for supplying animal feed at reasonable price if require. Prepare veterinary map showing hospital, dispensaries, first aid centre, AI sub centres and cattle population covered by each of these institutions. Arrange for short duration training course in veterinary medical care and prevention of epidemic among animals for staffs. Arrange for sufficient IEC materials for public awareness.

(B) Response Activities:

Alert the subordinate Officers and field staff on receipt of warning. Check and arrange personnel, stores, equipment, vehicles etc. and draw up tentative programme of emergency relief works. Visit the flood affected areas immediately with a veterinary relief team and start relief measures. Arrange with the help of district administration shifting of livestock to suitable high grounds. Open additional first aid centres and camps, dispensaries if necessary. Constantly visit the flood-affected areas and ensure effectiveness of the measures taken.

7. Checklist of Various Departments:

7.1 Preparedness Checklist for the District Commissioner:

Preparation of the DDMP with the assistance of DDMA. Setting up of District Control Room. Under the DDMP, district level agencies would be responsible for directing field interventions through various agencies right from the stage of warning to relief and rehabilitation. At the disaster site, specific tasks to manage the disaster will be performed. The District Commissioner will be an integral part of the DCR. The District Commissioner will be assisted by SOC. SOC will be headed by a Site Manager. Site Manager will co-ordinate the activities at various camp sites and affected areas. The Site Operations Centre (SOC) will report to the District Control Room. The District Commissioner will co-ordinate all the field responses which include, setting up of Transit Camps, Relief Camps and Cattle Camps ect.

7.2 Preparedness Checklist for the Police Department:

The department is familiar with the disaster response plan and response procedures are clearly defined. Orientation and training for disaster response plan and procedures undertaken. Special skills required during emergency operations imparted to the officials and the staff. Review and updated the precautionary measures and procedures, the precautions to be taken to protect equipment, the post-disaster procedures to be followed. Adequate warning mechanisms established for evacuation, equipments for rescue operations. An Officer has been designated as Nodal Officer for Disaster Management.

7.3 Preparedness Checklist for the Health Department:

Hospital staff is aware of which hospital rooms / buildings are damage proof. All the staff of the veterinary hospitals and centres has been informed about the possible disasters, likely damages and effects, and information about the ways to protect life, equipment and property. An area of the hospital identified for receiving large number of livestock. Emergency admission procedures with adequate record keeping developed. An Officer has been designated as Nodal Officer for Disaster Management. Sources of materials required for response operations have been identified and distributed during flood period. Thus, storage space available with private owners is used for storage and distribution during flood period. List of such storage facilities is provided here.

12.Preparedness and Mitigation

In disaster management cycle, preparedness and mitigation are the two important stages before the occurrence of disaster. It has a great importance in reduction of loss of life and property.

12.1Preparedness:

This protective process embraces measures which enable governments, communities and individuals to respond rapidly to disaster situations to cope with them effectively. Preparedness includes the formulation of viable emergency

plans, the development of warning systems, the maintenance of inventories and the training of personnel. It may also embrace search and rescue measures as well as evacuation plans for areas that may be at risk from a recurring disaster. Preparedness therefore is the state of readiness to deal with a threatening disaster situation or disaster and its consequences. All preparedness planning needs to be supported by appropriate legislation with clear allocation of responsibilities and budgetary provisions.

12.2 Mitigation:

Mitigation refers to all actions taken before a disaster to reduce its impacts, including preparedness and long-term risk reduction measures. Mitigation activities fall broadly into two categories:

- 1 Structural mitigation construction projects which reduce economic and social impacts.
- 2 Non-structural activities policies and practices which raise awareness of hazards or encourage developments to reduce the impact of disasters.

Mitigation includes reviewing building codes; vulnerability analysis updates; zoning and land-use management and planning; reviewing of building use regulations and safety codes; and implementing preventative health measures. Mitigation can also involve educating businesses and the public on simple measures they can take to reduce loss or injury, for instance fastening bookshelves, water heaters, and filing cabinets to walls to keep them from falling during earthquakes. Ideally, these preventative measures and public education programmes will occur before the disaster.

12.3Preparedness and Mitigation measures:

12.4 General Preparedness Measures:

1. Establishment of the Control Rooms

The district administration is focusing to ensure the round the clock operation of the control rooms in the district. The control rooms are presently run by major line departments at Police, Water Resource, Fire Service, Hospital level and our endeavour is to make it functional at Block and Village level.

2. Plan Updation

Disaster Management Plan needs updation at every interval. It includes the skilled manpower, their addresses and contact numbers, necessary equipments, medicinal stock, daily necessities, list of flood prone villages etc. All these things have to be updated after a certain interval of time. The DDMA Majuli has decided to update the plan on yearly basis.

3. Training for Govt. Officials and Disater Management Team Members:

The Govt. Officials of the line departments of the district should be updated on various aspects of disaster management by organizing regular training programmes for the officials. DDMA, Majuli visualizes to impart various training programme for the Govt. Officials and the members of various Search & Rescue teams in the district to increase efficacy at the time of need.

4. Organization of Mock Drills:

Mock drill is an integral part of the Community based disaster management plan, as it is a preparedness drill to keep the community alert. Mock drills are planned at various level of the community to keep the community updated and active. Mock drill should be organized once in six months as per the seasonality calendar of natural disaster events that is likely to occur.

5.Communication:

During disaster communication plays a vital, role in reducing the loss of life and property. For effective and proper communication DDMA has to develop a strong communication system and an inventory of contact numbers of all the concern persons up to the village level has to be prepared. DDMA, Majuli has set up a control room for any emergency

situation and it is equipped with the important contact numbers of the officials of the district which is updated on regular interval of time. Accordingly the other departments like Police, Fire, Medical; Water Resource has also developed their control rooms. DDMA envisage to develop a wireless network within the district up to the village level for better communication in future as when disaster strikes all the present communication systems like mobile network, landline, internet, rail-road network go down.

14. Response Plan:

The aim of emergency response is to provide immediate assistance to maintain life, improve health, and to support the morale of the affected population. Such assistance may range from providing specific but limited aid, such as assisting refugees with transportation, temporary shelter, and food, to establishing semi-permanent settlement in camps and other locations. It also may involve initial repairs to damaged infrastructure. The focus in the response phase is on meeting the basic needs of the people until more permanent and sustainable solutions can be found.

14.1 Aims of disaster response:

The overall aims of disaster response are:

- a)To ensure the survival of the maximum possible number of victims, keeping them in the best possible health in the circumstances.
- b)To re-establish self-sufficiency and essential services as quickly as possible for all population groups, with special attention to those whose needs are greatest: the most vulnerable and underprivileged.
- c)To repair or replace damaged infrastructure and regenerate viable economic activities. To do this in a manner that contributes to long term development goals and reduces vulnerability to any future recurrence of potentially damaging hazards.
- d)In situations of civil or international conflict, the aim is to protect and assist the civilian population, in close collaboration

with National and International agencies.

e) In cases involving population displacements (due to any type of disaster) the aim is to find durable solutions as quickly as possible, while ensuring protection and assistance as necessary in the meantime.

14.2 Disaster Response Activities:

14.2.1) Warning:

Warning refers to information concerning the nature of the danger and imminent disaster threats. Warnings must be rapidly disseminated to government officials, institutions and the population at large in the areas at immediate risk so that appropriate actions may be taken, namely, either to evacuate or secure property and prevent further damage. The warning could be disseminated via radio, television, the written press, telephone and PA system, VHF equipments and cell phone.

14.2.2) Search & Rescue (SAR):-

Search and rescue (SAR) is the process of identifying the location of disaster victims that may be trapped or isolated and bringing them to safety and medical attention. In the aftermath of Cyclone and Floods, SAR usually includes locating stranded flood victims, who may be threatened by rising water, and either bringing them to safety or providing them with food and first aid until they can be evacuated or returned to their homes. In the aftermath of Earthquake or Landslide, SAR normally focuses on locating people who are trapped and/ or injured in collapsed buildings.

14.2.3) Evacuation and Shelter Management:

Evacuation involves the relocation of a population from zones at risk of an imminent disaster to a safer location. The primary concern is the protection of life of the community and immediate treatment of those who may be injured.

For evacuation to work there must be:

- A timely and accurate warning system,
- Clear identification of escape routes,
- Designated shelter places for refugees with proper shelter management policy.

District Disaster Management Authority has identified places like Schools, Colleges, Community Halls, Places of Worship in the district to be used as Temporary shelter places.

14.2.4) Incident Response System & Incident Response Team:-

For effective response DDMA, Majuli has adopted the Incident response System and has constituted the Incident Response Team for the district.

14.2.5) For proper relief management DDMA has adopted the following operation procedure for the district.

1. Infrastructure Management:

- Shelters for affected people with sanitation facilities.
- Temporary structure for storage
- Kitchens
- Medical facilities
- Education facility
- * Recreational facility
- Temporary repairs to damaged infrastructure

2. Logistics Management:

- Organize facilities for staff and volunteers. Mobilize and co-ordinate the work of the volunteers ensuring community participation
- Organize distribution of Relief Supplies
- * Receive, store, secure, relief materials for relief camps and affected villages
- ❖ Co-ordinate supplies distributed directly by NGOs and other organizations including private donors
- * Ensure proper maintenance of vehicles and equipment
- Ensure optimum utilization of resources such as fuel, food, and other relief materials.

3. Health Management:

- Disposal of dead bodies
- Disposal of carcasses
- ❖ Disposal of waste, inspection of food, water supplies, sanitation ect.
- Treatment of the injured and the sick
- Preventive medicine and anti-epidemic actions

4. Communication & Information:

- ❖ Data collection.
- * Record keeping.
- Assistance in locating missing persons.
- Information centre.
- Organization of information for Site Operations Centre and on specific demands.
- ❖ Maintaining In-Message and Out-Message Register.
- ***** 5.Services Management:
- * Relief supplies to families or to households including water, clothing, and food.
- Arrangements for dry rations and family kits for cooking within two weeks of the disaster.
- Counselling services, services for mental health.
- * Restoration of family (including locating missing children, relatives, friends.)
- ❖ Assistance in locating missing cattle.
- * Assisting students to continue with their studies.
- Services for the orphans.
- Assisting individuals with special needs (pregnant women, infants, handicapped, old etc.).

4 6. Inventory Management:

- * Maintenance of
- ❖ Books of account for all cash receipts and disbursement.
- ❖ Stock and Issue register for all relief materials
- ❖ Dead stock register for all non-consumables (inventory)
- Record of all personnel payment on TA&DA, daily wages and other incidentals.
- Records of all transfer of funds (as advances) to other govt. departments (Suspense A/C)
- * Records of all cash vouchers and credit vouchers.
- * Records of all gratuitous relief.
- * Records of all compensation paid.

14.2.6) Public Grievances / Missing Persons Search:

A committee at the district level has to be constituted under the chairmanship of the District Collector to address the grievances of the public regarding missing persons. The search and rescue team should search for the missing persons living or dead.

14.2.7) Animal Care:

The animal husbandry department with necessary equipments in case of cattle death in the affected areas for the disposal of carcass with a view to restoration of public life and result oriented work. Make arrangements to treat the injured cattle. To vaccinate the animals against various diseases. Arrangement for pets and cattle should be made separately.

14.2.8) Management of Deceased:

The Carcasses Disposal team is responsible for clearing of carcasses after the disaster. The team should put in all efforts to check spread of diseases by disposing off the carcasses at the earliest and in the right manner. The health department will immediately start the procedure for post mortem of the dead persons as per the rules. Disposal of dead bodies is to be carried to prevent the outbreak of epidemics. Arrangement should be made to issue death certificates of the deceased to the

relatives.

14.2.9) NGOs and Voluntary Organizations:

NGOs and voluntary organisations are the first to respond before any outside assistance can reach the disaster site. In certain disaster prone areas a group of young volunteers are to be formed and trained to undertake essential tasks which would reduce loss of life and property. The voluntary organizations would contribute in ensuring:-

- 1. Communication links both within the community and with the administration.
- 2. Controlling rumours and panic behaviour by undertaking confidence building activities.
- 3. Organising local work teams for immediate rescue, and relief e.g. cooked food, first aid, and assistance in Law & Order
- 4. Guarding major installations and evacuated properties till the administration takes over.

14.2.10) Involvement of Defence and Paramilitary Forces:

At district level whatever help would be required during disaster that will be immediately informed to the various departments by the district collector and possible support NGOs and other line agencies in the district would be tapped up. If the District Collector thinks that it cannot cope with the disaster then he can seek for help and assistance from the defence and paramilitary force.

15. Pandamic (COVID-19) Response

On 31st December 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) China Country Office was informed of cases of pneumonia of unknown etiology (unknown cause) detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province of China. On 7th January 2020, Chinese authorities identified a new strain of Coronavirus as the causative agent for the disease. The virus has been renamed by WHO as SARS-CoV-2 and the disease caused by it as COVID-19. The disease since its first detection has affected all the provinces of China and 40 other countries (including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan).

Coronaviruses are zoonotic, meaning they are transmitted between animals and people. Detailed investigations found that SARS-CoV was transmitted from civet cats to humans and MERS- CoV from dromedary camels to humans. Several known coronaviruses are circulating in animals that have not yet infected humans. Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, cough, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties. In more severe cases, infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure and even death.

Standard recommendations to prevent infection spread include regular hand washing, covering mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing, thoroughly cooking meat and eggs. Avoid close contact with anyone showing symptoms of respiratory illness such as coughing and sneezing.

The first case of the COVID-19 pandemic in the Indian state of Assam was reported on 31 March 2020. As of 13 October 2020, the Government of Assam has confirmed a total of 89,468 positive cases of COVID-19 including 67,641 recoveries, three migrations and 234 deaths in the state. The state's as well as northeast's largest city, Guwahati, has been worst affected by coronavirus.

Action Plan For Cluster Containment

Institutional mechanisms and Inter-Sectoral Co-ordination

Deployment of Rapid Response Teams (RRT)

Under the supervision of the IDSP-District Surveillance Officer a Rapid Response Teams (RRT) was formed comprising of the followings:

- Clinician
- ☐ Microbiologist/Pathologist
- Epidemiologist
- Veterinary Officer
- Food safety officer
- o A list with the contact details of the core team and backups is compiled; it is up to date and easily accessible
- o A brief and concise document describing all roles and responsibilities is prepared and centrally accessible
- o All the team members are informed of, and trained in, their roles and responsibilities; a contact list and documentation are centrally accessible
- A place where the RRT can regularly meet shall be identified and necessary arrangements done.
- o In case of unavailability of core members during emergency, reserve specialists for each of the roles has to nominated
- o All the RRT members shall be supplied with necessary PPE kits

o The RRT will do listing of cases, contacts and their mapping. This will help in deciding the perimeter for action. The decision of the geographic limit and extent of perimeter control will be that of the State Government. However, likely scenarios and possible characteristics of the containment and buffer zone are given in Table-1.

Surveillance in containment zone

• Mapping of the containment and buffer zones

The containment and buffer zones are mapped to identify the health facilities (both government and private) and health workforce available (primary healthcare workers, Anganwadi workers and doctors in PHCs/CHCs/District hospitals).

• Active Surveillance

^{**} The decision to follow a containment protocol will be based on the risk assessment and feasibility of perimeter control.

The residential areas will be divided into sectors for the ASHAs/ Anganwadi workers/ANMs each covering 50 households (30 households in difficult areas). Additional workforce would be mobilized from neighboring districts (except buffer zone) to cover all the households in the containment zone. This workforce will have supervisory officers (PHC/CHC doctors) in the ratio of 1:4.

The field workers will be performing active house to house surveillance daily in the containment zone from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM. They will line list the family members and those having symptoms. The field worker will provide a mask to the suspect case and to the care giver identified by the family. The patient will be isolated at home till such time he/she is examined by the supervisory officer. They will also follow up contacts identified by the RRTs within the sector allocated to them.

All ILI/SARI cases reported in the last 14 days by the IDSP in the containment zone will be tracked and reviewed to identify any missed case of COVID-19 in the community.

Any case falling within the case definition will be conveyed to the supervisory officer who in turn will visit the house of the concerned, confirm that diagnosis as per case definition and will make arrangements to shift the suspect case to the designated treatment facility. The supervisory officer will collect data from the health workers under him/ her, collate and provide the daily and cumulative data to the control room by 4.00 P.M. daily.

MPW, AS, ASHA contacted with religious leader to collect the information of contact cases and create awareness in nearby household of suspect cases. All nearby household was advised not to became panic and maintain social distancing and not to believe in baseless news and ask the religious leader including VHSNC members to give awareness advices over phone to the community.

• Contact Tracing

The contacts of the laboratory confirmed case/ suspect case of COVID-19 will be line- listed and tracked and kept under surveillance at home for 28 days (by the designated field worker). The Supervisory officer in whose jurisdiction, the laboratory confirmed case/ suspect case falls shall inform the Control Room about all the contacts and their residential addresses. The control room will in turn inform the supervisory officers of concerned sectors for surveillance of the contacts. If the residential address of the contact is beyond the allotted sector, the district IDSP will inform the concerned Supervisory officer/concerned District IDSP/State IDSP.

• Surveillance in Buffer zone

The surveillance activities to be followed in the buffer zone are as follows:

- i. Review of ILI/SARI cases reported in the last 14 days by the District Health Officials to identify any missed case of COVID-19 in the community.
- ii. Enhanced passive surveillance for ILI and SARI cases in the buffer zone through the existing Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme.

iii. In case of any identified case of ILI/SARI, sample should be collected and sent to the designated laboratories for testing COVID-19.

All health facilities in the buffer zone will be listed as a part of mapping exercise. All such facilities both in Government and private sector (including clinics) shall report clinically suspect cases of COVID-19 on real time basis (including 'Nil' reports) to the control room at the district level. Measures such as personal hygiene, hand hygiene, social distancing to be enhanced through enhanced IEC activities in the buffer zone.

• Perimeter Control

The perimeter control will ensure that there is no unchecked outward movement of population from the containment zone except for maintaining essential services (including medical emergencies) and government business continuity. It will also limit unchecked influx of population into the containment zone. The authorities at these entry points will be required to inform the incoming travelers about precautions to be taken and will also provide such travelers with an information pamphlet and mask.

All vehicular movement, movement of public transport and personnel movement will be restricted. All roads including rural roads connecting the containment zone will be guarded by police.

The District administration will post signs and create awareness informing public about the perimeter control. Health workers posted at the exit point will perform screening (e.g. interview travelers, measure temperature, record the place and duration of intended visit and keep complete record of intended place of stay).

Details of all persons moving out of perimeter zone for essential/ emergency services will be recorded and they will be followed up through IDSP. All vehicles moving out of the perimeter control will be decontaminated with sodium hypochlorite (1%) solution.

<u>Guidelines for testing, quarantine, hospital admission for COVID—19 based on current risk</u> assessment

- □ Contact tracing: The contacts of positive cases shall be line listed and tracked within 12 hrs. of the case being confirmed/suspected.
- a. Primary Contact/direct contacts to the positive case is defined as
- i. Person providing direct care without proper personal protective equipment (PPE) for COVID 19 patients
- ii. Staying in the same close environment of a COVID 19 patient (including work place, class rooms, household and gatherings)
- iii. Travelling together with close proximity (1m) with a COVID 19 patient in any kind of conveyance within a 14 day period after the onset of symptoms in the case under consideration
- b. All other contacts shall be treated as secondary contacts
- c. Every person in the above category shall be identified and enlisted as contacts for tracing along with their names, address and contact details.

- d. All the contacts shall be kept under home isolation immediately and kept under surveillance at home for 28 days. They shall be visited daily to verify if they and ask him/her if had developed symptoms.
- e. The details of contacts traced, their quarantine status, sample and testing status shall be updated DSO and district control room.

Clinical decision making algorithm for persons from countries/areas with reported transmission of COVID 19, primary contacts, secondary contacts:

- 1. A person within 14 days of return from a country/area with reported local
- 2. Primary contacts
- 3. Secondary contact

LABORATORY SUPPORT

Designated laboratories

At present the samples collected in the district are being sent to Jorhat Medical College for testing on a regular basis.

All test results should be available within 12 hours of sampling. The contact number of such courier agencies shall be a part of the micro-plan.

The designated laboratory will provide daily update (daily and cumulative) to District, State and Central Control Rooms on:

- i. No. of samples received
- ii. No. of samples tested
- iii. No. of samples under testing
- iv. No. of positive sample

HOSPITAL CARE

All suspect cases detected in the containment areas (till a diagnosis is made), will be hospitalized and kept in isolation in a designated facility till such time they are tested negative. Persons testing positive for COVID-19 will remain to be hospitalized till such time 2 of their samples are tested negative as per MoHFW's discharge policy. About 15% of the patients are likely to develop pneumonia, 5 % of whom requires ventilator management.

Hence dedicated Intensive care beds need to be identified earmarked. Some among them may progress to multi organ failure and hence critical care facility/ dialysis facility/ and Salvage therapy [Extra Corporeal Membrane Oxygenator (ECMO)] facility for managing the respiratory/renal complications/ multi-organ failure shall be required. If such facilities are not available in the containment zone, nearest tertiary care facility in Government / private sector needs to be identified, that becomes a part of the micro-plan.

Surge capacity

Based on the risk assessment, if the situation so warrants (data suggested an exponential rise in the number of cases), the surge capacity of the identified hospitals will be enhanced, private hospitals will be roped in and sites for temporary hospitals identified and it's logistic requirements shall be worked out.

Pre-hospital care (ambulance facility)

Ambulances need to be in place for transportation of suspect/confirmed cases. Such ambulances shall be manned by personnel adequately trained in infection prevention control, use of PPE and protocol that needs to be followed for disinfection of ambulances (by 1% sodium hypochlorite solution using knapsack sprayers).

Quarantine and isolation:

Quarantine and Isolation are important mainstay of cluster containment. These measures help by breaking the chain of transmission in the community.

Ouarantine:

All house holds and contacts of a confirmed and/or suspected cases shall be immediately home quarantined.

a. All those are in home quarantine shall be followed up till the time of test results of suspect case comes negative. If the test result comes postitive all such persons become "true contacts" who shall have to be Home quarantined for 14 days and follow up has to be done for 28 days.

Isolation:

Suspect cases detected on active surveillance need to be isolated in a room in the house temporarily till the time he/she is examined by the supervisory medical officer or shifted by the designated ambulance to the designated facility.

Preventive public health measures:

There will be social mobilization among the population for adoption of community- wide practice of frequent washing of hands and respiratory etiquettes in the contained area. The community will also be encouraged to self

monitor their health and report to the visiting ASHA/Anganwadi worker or to nearest health facility.

Social distancing measures:

For the cluster containment, social distancing measures are key interventions to rapidly curtail the community transmission of COVID-19 by limiting interaction between infected persons and susceptible hosts. The following measures would be taken:

Closure of schools, colleges and work places:

Intensive risk communication campaign will be followed to encourage all persons to stay indoors for an initial period of 28 days, to be extended based on the risk assessment. Based on the risk assessment and indication of successful containment operations, an approach of staggered work

and market hours may be put into practice.

Cancellation of mass gatherings:

All mass gathering events and meetings in public or private places, in the containment and buffer zones shall be cancelled / banned till such time, the area is declared to be free of COVID-19 or the outbreak has increased to such scales to warrant mitigation measures instead of containment.

Advisory to avoid public places:

The public in the containment and buffer zones will be advised to avoid public places and only if necessary for attending to essential services. The administration will ensure supply of enough masks to the households in the containment areas if necessary.

Cancellation of public transport (bus/rail)

There will be prohibition for persons entering the containment zone and on persons exiting the containment zone. To facilitate this, if there are major bus transit hubs or railway stations in the containment zone, the same would be made dysfunctional temporarily. Additionally, irrespective of fact that there is a rail/road transit hub, the perimeter control will take care of prohibiting people exiting the containment zone including those using private vehicles and taxies.

As a significant inconvenience is caused to the public by adopting these measures in the containment zone, District administration would proactively engage the community and work with them to make them understand the benefits of such measures.

Transportation

A large number of vehicles will be required for mobilizing the surveillance and supervisory teams. The vehicles will be pooled from Government departments. The shortfall, if any, will be met by hiring of vehicles.

Bio-medical waste management

A large quantity of bio-medical waste is expected to be generated from containment zone.

Arrangement would also be required for such bio-medical waste (discarded PPEs etc.), preferably by utilizing the bio-medical waste management services at the designated hospital. RISK

COMMUNICATION

Risk communication material:

Risk communication materials comprising of

- (i) posters and pamphlets;
- (ii) audio only material;
- (iii) AV films prepared by State government, NHM and district administration will be used for targeted roll out in the containment areas.

Communication channels:

Interpersonal communication

During house to house surveillance, ASHAs/ other community health workers will interact with the community

- (i) for reporting symptomatic cases
- (ii) contact tracing

(iii) Information on preventive public health measures.

Mass communication

Awareness will be created among the community through miking, distribution of pamphlets, mass SMS and social media. Also use of radio and television (using local channels) will ensure penetration of health messages in the target community.

Dedicated helpline

The DEOC will be designated as dedicated helpline and its number will be widely circulated for providing general population with information on risks of COVID-19 transmission, the preventive measures required and the need for prompt reporting to health facilities, availability of essential services and administrative orders on perimeter control.

16. Managing flood relief camps in context of COVID -19 outbreak in Assam

Assam is approaching flood season. This year the challenge to support those who might get affected due to flood will be even tougher due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic across the globe which has also affected Assam. Relief Camp Management Guidelines are included as Appendix-XXXV of the Assam Disaster Management Manual, 2015². In order to be better equipped to deal with flood situation vis-à-vis COVID-19 context, this document has been developed to serve as an addendum. This document will be used by all District Disaster Management Authority (DDMAs), SDO (Civil) and Revenue Circle Officers for management of Relief camps during ensuing flood season.

Major highlights of the addendum to existing Relief Camp Management Guideline are as follows:

Relief Camps and Accommodation capacity to be earmarked in advance: Identify additional relief camps in addition to the existing pre-identify camps as per population density of villages to earmark space for social distancing. Ensure 7 Sq. m. of area per person instead of 3.5 Sq. m. to validate social distancing of at least one meter between any two camp inmates (calculation of intake Capacity of Relief Camps are given in the table nextpage).
Toilets facilities and the populations: Sufficient Toilet facilities have to be provided in proportionate to the intake camp capacity. Coordinate with PHE Deptt. to ensure thesame.
Ensure sufficient sanitation facility: Ensure sufficient Hand-wash/soap, sanitizers, masks for the camp inmates. The Relief camp premises should be strictly notified as no-spitting, notobaccozone.
Medical Support & Health Surveillance Team: Daily monitoring (in place of weekly) of health condition shall be done by the health team on duty in the camp following all precautions and guidelines. Medical team should be armored with basic PPE for conducting screening during registration process. Pre-identification of the Medical facilities like Ambulances for transportation of infected, isolation facilities nearbyetc. In case of sneezing, cough, fever & common cold, immediate medical supervision to be made and he/she may be kept separately as per COVID-19 norms & regulations.
e-Help desk: e-Help desk should be facilitated in all Operational Relief camps with the help of <i>Pratirodhi Bondhu</i> as counselor/ facilitator. These desks will emphasis on the facilities available on the e-help platform (e.g. Telemedicine, e-pashu etc.), a joint venture of ASDMA and CSC-SPV.

Pratirodhi Bondhu: The Revenue Circle Administration may engage Pratirodhi Bondhu volunteers available in the revenue circle as per theguidelines.
SOP for relief/cooked food distribution in camps: SoP should be prepared in collaboration with ASDMA for distribution of relief items/cooked food adhering precautionary measure as per COVID-19 norms & regulations.
Arrangement for fodder Livestock: Pre-identify the highland areas e.g. tea gardens etc. with green grasses for arrangement of the green fodder for livestock of the farmers/ campinmates.
Quarantine/isolation facility: Quarantine/isolation facilities may be identified on higher altitudes by the district administration for transfer of COVID-19 suspected cases.

The detailed addenda to existing relief camp management guideline are comprehensively cited in the table below for managing flood relief camp vis-à-vis COVID-19:

- Camp register should also maintain separately information about pregnant women, infants, elderly, people with existing health conditions and persons with disability.
- People presenting with fever and or fever like symptoms should be immediately segregated and taken for medicalcare.
- If required, such infected/identified persons should be shifted to designated quarantine/isolation facilities within the relief camps or location pre-identified by the district administration.
- Immediate information to 104 shall be provided for any case related to COVID-19 in the camp (asymptomatic and symptomatic).
- Special accommodation facility for elderly, pregnant lady and PwD (People with Disability) should bearranged.
- Each camp should have "**Information Board**" capturing contact details of key service providers for immediate support displayed in local language and Capacity of the Camp to accommodate inmates adhering the COVID-19 norms & regulations.
- Appropriate IEC for prevention of COVID infection to be displayed in local language using pictorial depiction and lessertext.

Basic Facilities

Water:

- Disinfection measures for drinking water shall be practiced for water provisioned for drinkingto camp inmates.
- Hand washing bay shall be established in each camp with multiple hand washing points at appropriate distance with soap should be provided at entry and exit ofcamp
- Water shall be made available. Per person availability shall be increased to 30 litre/person/day.

Sanitation:

- All guidelines for sanitation facilities in relief camps should be strictlymaintained
- Ensure sufficient Handwash/soap, sanitizers, masks for the campinmates.
- Cleaning of common spaces shall be done thrice a day particularly handrails, door latches, switches etc. which are frequentlytouched
- Adequate disinfectant shall be made available in the camp.
- Mosquito control measures to be strictlyfollowed

Food Storage and Distribution:

- Any food item brought to the camp must be sanitized appropriately as per disinfection protocol. All packed items shall be cleaned properly using disinfectants.
- Special care should be taken/ SoP should be prepared for distribution of cooked food adhering to precautionary measure as per COVID-19 norms & regulations.
- Food items provided to young children should follow global Infant and young child recommendations, and remain in line with Infant Milk Substitute Act available at:http://www.bpni.org/docments/IMS-act.pdf
- Proper food hygiene should be maintained by cook whether cooking is done family wise or a community kitchen isestablished.
- Kitchen and food storage area should be sanitized thrice daily and camp inmates shall be sensitized in this regard by camp-incharge/ frontline workers onduty.
- Appropriate IECs on food safety shall be displayed in the cooking and dining area. The IECs are availableat:
 - https://fssai.gov.in/cms/coronavirus.php
- Pregnant women and lactating mothers at the camp should be provided relevant information on covid19, pregnancy, childbirth andbreastfeeding.

Clothing:

- Appropriate arrangements shall be made for detergents and washing spaces for camp inmates to maintain clothhygiene.
- Adequate provision of bed-nets shall bemade.

Medical and Psychosocial Support:

- Medical team should be armored with basic PPE for conducting screening during registration process.
- Pre-identification of the Medical facilities like Medical team, Ambulances for transportation of infected, isolation facilities nearbyetc.
- Home quarantine people to be shifted to quarantine centers and they shall not be kept in the reliefcamps.
- Daily monitoring (in place of weekly) of health condition shall be done by the health team on duty in the camp following all precautions and guidelines.
- Any suspected case shall be immediately shifted to designated health facility/ quarantine centre.
- All protocols for safety or camp inmates and staff on duty shall be strictly adhered to.
- All other guidelines in the relief camp management manual regarding medical and psychosocial support shall beimplemented.
- Standby arrangements for transportation of symptomatic cases shall be made in all camps with more than 200 inmates (in place of 500)
- Wearing of masks inside the camp may be made compulsory. Sufficient masks maybe provided by the DDMAs.

Special arrangements for Children, women, physically challenged and elderly

- Identify and operationalize child friendly spaces for integrated service delivery to women & children. Maintain social distancing in all activities conducted.
- Within CFS, ensure learning corners for 3-6 age group children and school children in the age group 06-14 years for engaging them in different learning and recreational activities maintaining social distancingguidelines.
- Ensure availability of learning and recreational material (Anganwadi in a box or school in a box) for children in all learningcorners.
- Teachers and Anganwadi workers designated for Child Friendly Spaces shall take all precautions to keep themselves and the childrensafe.
- Ensure appropriate care of breastfeeding and lactating mothers, promote breastfeeding and ensure access to basic nutrition for both mother and children. Ensure proper care and hygiene is maintained by pregnant women and lactating mothers. Some of the actions for different high risk groupsinclude.
 - For under five children, following needs to be provided by the district healthauthorities:
 - Counselling on age appropriate feeding including exclusive breast feeding (upto 6months) and complementary feeding(6-23months)
 - IFA syrup for anemia prevention and treatment as per Anemia Mukt Bharatguidelines
 - ORS packet and zinc as per-positioning for treatment ofdiarrhea
 - Provision for regular screening for malnutrition and referrals to healthfacility
 - For pregnant women, following needs to be provided by the district healthauthorities:
 - Antenatalcheck
 - IFA and calciumsupplements
 - Resting area in reliefcamp
 - For lactating mothers, following needs to be provided by the district healthauthorities:
 - IFA and calciumsupplements
 - Breastfeeding counselling andsupport



17. Child Friendly Spaces in Relief Camps

CFS is a place designed and operated in a participatory manner where children affected by disasters can be provided with a safe environment, integrated services including play, recreation, education, health, and psychosocial support and/or information about services/supports provided. The purpose of CFSs is to support the resilience and well-being of children through, structured activities conducted by community in a safe, child friendly, and stimulating environment.

District Administration will set up "Child Friendly Spaces (CFS)" in every Relief camp in coordination with Line departments and NGOs / civil society organizations. All protocols for COVID-19 containment including safety and security of children will be ensured in CFS

Child Friendly Spaces are a critical and non-negotiable component of relief camp management in Assam. This guidance is set forth to supplement the guidance on flood relief camp management in the context of COVID-19 issued via No. RGR/ASDMA. 09/2014/323 dated 24th April 2020 and the basic guidelines for implementation of Child Friendly Spaces in Emergencies under NSSP, 2016 issued via letter No. ASDMA/101/2017/Pt/28 dated 5th July 2018. The following needs to be adhered to with regard to Child Friendly Spaces in relief camps in the current scenario:

Education and recreational Services

- Organize children as per age group 3-6 years, 6-14 years and 14-19 years
- Ensure attendance of children as per the defined agegroup
- As per the pre-developed routine, conduct regular classes in a more generic and supplementary manner with special provisions for persons withdisability
- Engage children in quiz, knowledge test games, storytelling, story making and other such interactive activities which require less/no movement and can be done maintaining social distancing
- Wherever feasible organize radio/television classes or classes through Diksha app amongchildren
- Facilitate physical activities which do not requiring touching one another and physical distancing can be maintained. School in a Box and Anganwadi in a box concepts shall be implemented asfeasible
- Conduct painting, creative art, singing and such other activities to facilitate their engagement and support them in dealing with emerging stress
- Observe children who are silent, in fear, shock or anxious and provide them individual care in ventilating theirfeelings
- Provide appropriate and timely guidance to children on the existing and emergingscenario
- Conduct life skills session with focus onadolescents
- Ensure through regular monitoring of the attendance register that children remain accountedfor

Protection Services

- Account for any unaccompanied children in the camp
- Educate children about their safety both online and offline safety during their stay in the reliefcamp
- Share regarding the associated risks such as violence, trafficking and abuse that may happen during and after flood and in COVIDsituation
- Provide information related to child protection services that are available to support in case of any such issues e.g., ChildLine, DCPU, JJB, CWCetc.
- Support children in revealing any unwanted experience that they might have experienced in the camp and support them in reportingthose.
- Place a complain box in the CFS or in a strategic location in the camp

2. INTRODUCTION:-

Majuli is a river island situated itself in the state of Assam, mid-stream of the great river Brahmaputra. It is a unique fluvial landform formed as a result of dynamic river system. The island is bounded by river Brahmaputra in the South and river Subansiri in the North-West and the Kherkotia suti in the North-East. Due to its peculiar location on active floodplain of Brahmaputra river, Majuli experiences inundated even during normal floods. The nature of flooding, its frequency and magnitude has been changing and increasing over the year. Every year at least 3 waves of flood affect Majuli with different intensity.

The island extends to about 80 K.M in length and 20-25 K.M in width in North-South direction. There are many chapories in the Majuli Circle area. The chapories along with the main lands of Majuli Circle is highly flood prone. There are total 71 numbers of revenue villages in Kamalabari and non cadastral villages also in Ahataguri Mouza.

4.1 INTRODUCTION

Majuli is a river island situated itself in the state of Assam, mid-stream of the great river Brahmaputra. It is a unique fluvial landform formed as a result of dynamic river system. The island is bounded by river Brahmaputra in the South and river Subansiri in the North-West and the Kherkotia suti in the North-East. Due to its peculiar location on active floodplain of Brahmaputra river, Majuli experiences inundated even during normal floods. The nature of flooding, its frequency and magnitude has been changing and increasing over the year. Every year at least 3 waves of flood affect Majuli with different intensity.

The island extends to about 80 K.M in length and 20-25 K.M in width in North-South direction. There are many chapories in the Ujani Majuli Circle area. 



NAME OF SUB-DIVISION: KAMALABARI W. R. SUB-DIVISION

5.1 INTRODUCTION

Majuli is the lone river Island district of India situated in the lowerenergy fluvial system of River Brahmaputra in upper Assam. It is a unique landform developed as a result of fluvial and dynamic process of Brahmaputra river system. The Island is bound by River Brahmaputra in the South and River Subansiri in the North-West and the KherkutiaSuti in the North-East. The total geographical area of Majuli District is 483 Sq km. Earlier Majuli was a sub-division under Jorhat District but declared as a district since Sept. 2016. According to 2011 census, it has population of about 1,64,513. The Island extends about 80 kmin length along East-West direction and 20-25 kmin width along North South direction. There are many Chapories around the main mass of Majuli Island which are the parts of the Majuli.



The Chapories along with main land of Majuli District is highly prone to Flood and Erosion. The total no. of Revenue Villages was 210, but now only 141 numbers exist due to loss of landmassin erosion during last three decades. Out of total existing 141 villages of the district, 103 villages (65%) are vulnerable for flood.

5.2 PROBLEM OF FLOOD IN MAJULI ISLAND

Flood is a perennial problem affecting people of Majuli every year duringmonsoon

season. Majuli gets inundated not only in severe floods but also innormal flood cycles. Every year, at least three waves of floods affect Majuli withdifferent intensities. The island has been experiencing floods for a long time as it is an integral part of the active floodplain of River Brahmaputra. Floods here areassociated with huge loss of life and property such as houses, crops etc., spreadof epidemic, non-availability of essential commodities, artificial price-rise, non-availability sufficient medicines, drinking water etc.

After 1950 earthquake, spilling of the Brahmaputra in the upper reaches of the island started in large scale and thus immediate measures as per the National Flood Policy of Govt. of India had to be taken to contain the spilling by way of constructing embankment system.

The core area of Majuli Island has been protected by embankment system of Water Resources Department (WRD). These embankment systems play a vital role in during every flood season which gives reasonable protection to a vast area of the district. Table 1 shows the list of embankments under WRD in Majuli District. Out of the total 116.44 km of embankment in the district, the Brahmaputra River has 83.857 km of embankment and Subansiri River has the rest 32.583 km of embankments.

Major flood events occurred in the Island during the year 1988 and 1991. In 1998, the flood waters submerged almost the entire island. Even the Satraswere under 6-7 feet deep water. The flood wiped out entire standing crops and rendered thousands acres sterile depositing millions of tones of sand.

The recent flood scenario reveals that nature of flooding, frequency, and extent of flood damage has been increasing over the years. Although flood is an integral part of life here, the untimely and severe floods in the recent years makethe community highly vulnerable and less resilient compared to earlier days.

The embankment system located at upper Majuli area remains under tremendous flood pressure and sometimes breach occurs in the embankment causing loss of life and widespread damage to properties and agriculture. These embankment systems are the major shelter facility during flood period and also serve as the main communication roads.




5.4 FLOOD PREPARDNESS OF WRD, MAJULI

Control room:

The Departmental Control Room will be functioning in the office of the Asstt. Executive Engineer, Kamalabari W. R. Sub-Division at Kamalabari with effect from 15th May 2022 to 30th October 2022, round the clock. Flood message will be transmitted every day at 12 Hours from the Control Room. Telephone No. of Control Room - 8638753661.

Field Staff:-

Field staff are detailed in their respective sections/beats as shown in Annexure-I. The placement of staff will be slightly modified after starting of the Control Room and final placement of staff will be immediately intimated to DDMA Majuli, District Administration and Higher Authority of this Department.

Flood Drill Works :-

The Water Resources Department has already started identification of vulnerable areas of the embankment and Flood Drill works will be taken up with the fund to be made available by the department for safeguarding the existing flood management structures like embankments. Before every flood season, flood fighting materials will be centrally stocked in the Divisional Store at Kamalabari and sent to the different sections/beats as per requirements.

Earth stakes will be made at vulnerable areas of embankments. In addition to this, routine patrolling works are undertaken during every flood event.

Material Bank:-

The Govt. of Assam has taken a new initiative under the SDRF to create a MATERIAL BANK at a central location of the district at Majuli for storing emergency flood fighting etc.

The list of materials now available for utilization at Material Bank-

Geo textile bags of Type A (size 1.03 m x 0.70 m) = 17000 Nos

Geo textile bags of Type B (size 2.00 m x 1.50 m) = 6000 Nos

Serviceable Gunny Bags = 11020 Nos

Empty cement bags = 10000 Nos.

In case of empty cement bags steps will be taken to procure fresh bags before the onset of flood season. Every year 90000 to 100000 empty cement bags are required during the flood season.

5.5 VULNERABLE REACHES OF EMBANKMENT IN MAJULI:-

As on today there is no any critically vulnerable reaches amongst the embankment network in Majuli. At Sumoimari, Kumargaon, Botiamari, Bokora, Goalgaon embankment got strengthened during the process of hard cresting by PWD department.

Yet with respect to the configuration of river, alignment of the embankment,

previous history of the location, there are some vulnerable locations where boiling and seepages occur during high flood period even though the section of the embankment appears to be good. At Sumoimari area, continuous observation and quick response is needed during flood period.

5.6 PROBLEM OF RIVER BANK EROSION IN MAJULI DISTRICT:-

According to reports, in 1853, the total area of Majuli was 1,250 km² and about 60% of this landmass has been eroded in the latter half of 20th century. After the great earthquake of 1950, erosion of the River Brahmaputra in Majuli reach became active and a part of the south east and south west side of the island was eroded away by the river causing increasing threat to the island and its rich natural and cultural heritage. This has affected the biodiversity of the island's flora and fauna, socio cultural fabric and the demographic pattern of the population. One third of the Satras of the island had to be shifted to the north and south bank of the Brahmaputra. Since 1991, over 35 villages have been washed away.

5.7 BANK EROSION DUE TO THE BRAHMAPUTRA:

It has been observed that there has been a continuous shift in bank line of Brahmaputra river channel indicating significant erosion affect at many places of Majuli island.

- a) There was significant migration of River Brahmaputra during the period of 1966-75 to 1988. Heavy erosion was caused by this river during this period as the river migrates towards north at most of the places. The river channel had migrated for a distance of about 6.49 km near Mayadevi, 5.24 km near ManikmukhKumargaon, 1.73 km at BengenaAti and 4.24 kms near Khoraparagaon.
- b) During the period of 1998-08 it was evidenced that SubansiriRiver had shifted its course and joined at Brahmaputra 15 km ahead of its earlier point of debouch in the western part of MajuliIsland. This result in erosion of Majuli island and thereby decreasing the total area. The next 65 km mainly showed migration towards north. The river migrated towards north about 1.53 km near Khoraparagaon, 1.14 km near Bengenaati, 1.53 km near Rajgurubari and 2.5 km near UjaniGajeragaon. In between, the river had migrated towards south at

Khoraholagaon and Kapahchali for about a distance of 1.25 km and 1.8 km respectively with reference to the 1998 position of the river bank line.

5.8 BANK EROSION DUE TO THE RIVER SUBANSIRI:

The Subansiri carries enormous silt load in flood season for whichgradient of the riverbed in the hilly and piedmont reach is very steep and in the plains it is much flatter and thereby has lost her stability in plains. Enormous silt with high velocity gets deposited in the bed of the river itself in the plains causing aggradations and the river becomes braided resulting bank erosion. The great earthquake of 1950 had also caused change of course of the river along with aggradations of the bed.

- a) The bank line migration of river Subansiri was observed during 1966-1975 to 1988 near Bahumari and Nunibari for a distance of about 3.12 km towards south. The Subansiri migrated towards northfor 0.64 km at the western end of Majuli causing deposition. Within 20 to 40 km towards east of the island, the river recedes away towards north for 2.02 km at Major Chapori and for 2.86 km at Kumaliagaon causing deposition. For the rest of the distance from 35 to 80 km the river migrated towards south a maximum of 1.25 km at Chaporigaon and 1.21 km at Jengrai causing erosion.
- b) During 1998-2008 major change occurred. The SubansiriRiver had shifted it course towards east and met Brahmaputra about 15 km ahead from its earlier confluence. Therefore, the river migrated towards north about 1.58 km at Major Chapori which shows deposition of sediments to the island. In the block within 25 km to 35 km the river migrated towards south with a maximum of 2.71 km at Auniati and with 0.8 km at Kumaliagaon resulting in heavy erosion of the land area of MajuliIsland. The river has migrated for a distance of more than 3 km towards south at Bahumari and Nunibari. These two places also evidenced highest rate of migration during this period.

5.9 EROSION AFFECTED REACHES IN MAJULI

During carrying out of survey by machine boat along Kherkotia, Subansiri and Tuni river it was observed severe bank erosion at various vulnerable locations in many areas mostly in the concave reaches which is posing a threat to the existing dyke and its adjoining areas. Erosion affected locations and reaches are listed as follows-



- v) Chikarigaon to Lachongaon for a reach reach length of about 1.60km, severe slope damages due to occurrence of continuous heavy rain. (Ch. 13300.00m to 14,900.00m)

ACTION PLAN

6.3 Activities:

Activities necessary for responding to floods, if there is any during the current year, have been planed as follows:

6.3 (A) PRE FLOOD:

- i) Identifying the vulnerable areas of the schemes.
- ii) Checking against unauthorized construction likely to damage Irrigation structures.
- iii) Regular monitoring of increasing water level of rivers.
- iv) Holding awareness programmes among the field staff along with local people.
- v) Identifying alternative roads for shifting the materials, when necessary.
- vi) Issuing strict direction to field staff not to leave Head Quarter except with prior permission of authority under unavoidable circumstances.
- vii) Identifying safe and high ground for keeping the most valuable machineries such as motor, pump sets, panel board etc. from being damaged, if when necessary.
- viii) Engagement of man power for shifting of machineries etc. to the identified safe places, if necessary, by thela, boat, light vehicle etc. whichever may be suitable at the time.

6.3 (B) DURING FLOOD

- i) Constituting Quick Response Team for vulnerable areas.
- ii) Deployment of field staff for day and night shifting duties where necessary.
- iii) Inspection of Irrigation schemes in flood affected areas and taking necessary safety measures as far as practicable.
- iv) Keeping close touch with the Mechanical & Electrical wings of this Deptt. for safe up keep of pumps, motors, barges, transformers and Mechanical/Electrical component.
- v) Immediately reporting damages suffered by departmental assets to Revenue Authority, DDMA & Departmental higher ups.
- vi) Lending available man power to District Administration, if necessary for flood relief duties.

6.4 (C) AFTER FLOOD:

- i) Assessing damages suffered by the Irrigation structures due to flood.
- ii) Taking up steps for remedial measures i.e. immediate temporary restoration works.
- iii) Initiating necessary formalities for preparation of plan and estimates for repairing of the damaged structures for permanent restoration work, for onward submission of the same to the Govt. for necessary approval as per SDRF norms.

6.5 Strategy from District to village level:

- **(A) At District (Division) level**, the Executive Engineer will be in overall command for operation of the Action Plan in respect of all affected areas under his jurisdiction. The Executive Engineer will be the competent authority for all major decision and he will interact with the District Administration or with higher authorities of Irrigation Deptt. as and when necessary.
- **(B) At Sub-Division level**, the respective Assistant Executive Engineer of the Irrigation Sub-Division under Majuli Division (Irrigation) in Majuli District will oversee the measures to be taken for flood affected areas under their jurisdiction. They will organize and deploy field staff as per necessary and keep informing the Executive Engineer and Local Administration about the emerging flood situation in their respective jurisdiction.
- **(C)** At village (field) level, the field staff from S.O., S.A. down to Gr-IV staff will keep watch over the schemes entrusted to them and will take all practicable measures as per demand of the situation. They will be in constant touch with their Controlling Officers.

<u>ACTION PLAN UNDER A.H..& VETY.DEPTT.MAJULI DISTRICT:</u>

Among the national calamities the flood in Majuli District is a regular phenomenon which causes damaged and untold miseries to human & Livestock. During such crisis period the Deptt. Have to play a vital role in protection the following livestock population (2019 Livestock Census report) from the various disease epidemic treating ailing feeds etc.to the flood affected animals & livestock.

Majuli Revenue Circle:

Large Animal81209Small Animal34980Poultry59906

To save the livestock of animals of above population the following measure may be taken to measure the situation.

PHASE :- (A) <u>Before flood measure</u> (B) <u>During Flood measure</u> (c) <u>Post flood measures</u>.

(A) <u>BEFORE FLOOD MEASURES</u>:

- 1. For taking flood measures before flood the Vety.Officer/Block Vety. OfficerS are directed to identify the pocket areas of endemic disease and ensure the template Vaccination of the areas before flood. They are also instructed to identify high land cattle plat form to rescue of the flood affected animals and poultry and they are also asked to identify the areas for availability of feed age and fodder in their respective areas.
- 2. The Director of A.H.&Vety. Deptt.,Assam, Guwahati-3 is requested to arrange for regular supply of adequate medicine, vaccines, instruments and appliances and camping materials etc.to the Dist.A.H.&Vety.Office,Majuli as per indent.
- 3. Sufficient stock of medicine appliances etc. which are necessary will be kept in the Dispensary/F.A.C./Sub-Centre etc. So, that no complain are received the ailing animals could not be treated for crisis of medicines.

B. DURING FLOOD MEASURES:

1. All the Vety.Officer/Block Vety.Officer/V.F.A./Gr.IV for the District areas has been remain vigilance for taking prompt action in occurrence of flood in their respective Dispensary jurisdiction areas. They should also inform the L/I/ S.V.F.A./V.F.A./S.M.and other relief staff under their jurisdiction to keep vigil in the areas allotted G/P frequently and report to the District authority about any emergency flood condition in their village and will render necessary advice to them to solve the situation.

- 2. They are also directed to kept them self ready to move any time and day to the affected areas of the District for flood duty when need. They will be detain in the areas where flood is reported adequate medicines, vaccine will be instructed tomeet the situation and kept constant visit on outbreak of disease and livestockmortality.
- 3. As soon as incidence of livestock mortality is reported it will immediately be attended and action will be taken to diagnose the disease and to combat the situation be deploying adequate resource of necessary staff will be detained in affected areas to camp there till the disease is brought under control. Action will be taken for proper disposal of carcasses of prevention of further spread of the disease.
- 4. The Vety. Officer/Block Vety. Officer should be kept close contact with their respective areas flood Sector/ Zonal Officer and should be report immediately to the Sector/ Zonal Officer (Flood) when needed and occurrence of flood for rescue of Animals to the safety places. Direction has also be given to the Vety.Officer/Block Vety.Officer and other para Vety.staff of the District that the whole Majuli District is divided in to three Flood Zone arrears .Such flood Zone areas will be look after by team of Vety. Relief team led by one Vety.Officer/Block Vety.Officer as team leader.
- 5. The Vety.Officer/Block Vety.Officer and para Vety.staff is directed to be present in relief distribution site which will be distribution through GaonBurah& Revenue Depttshall assist in obtaining APRs & equal distribute as needed.
- 6. For report of any loss of death of livestock will be properly investigation with help of Gaonpradhan/Latmandal, local flood relief committee and authentic report will be submit to the District authority.
- 7. Constant touch and Co-Operation with the District Commissioner, Majuli will maintained if any feed and fodder required for feeding livestock during flood affected area. There is no cattle feed meal or agency at Majuli Dist. for meeting the emergent unavailable circumstances. The requisition will be place to the D.C. Majuli, for arrangement may be made through the D.C. and flood relief fund for collection and re-transport of feed/fodder to the distress areas.
- 8. All the requisition of flood requirement will be through the D.C. Majuli and is request for fund arrangement of purchasing Cattle feed/fodder etc.
- 9. The staff position Majuli Districts not sufficient. So additional staff may be required during the time of flood. The Director, A.H.& Vety. Deptt., Assam, Guwahati-3 is request kindly to deploy additional staff to the District when request is place to place and time to time from nearest District.
- 10. The sector wise Para Vety. Staffs are engaged in the Gaon Panchayat for rendering flood relief work is enclosed herewith.(Annexure 1)

C. POST FLOOD MEASURE:-

- 1. The constant supervision for flood area is equally important and the Vety. and Para Vety. staffs are directed to help and assistance along with advice an hygienic management of livestock feed/fodder and addible water.
- 2. The Vety. staff will have to vigilance in their respective area for moment of stick animals. The various measures for pre flood during flood and post flood measures and discussed thoroughly with Vety. Field staff of MajuliDistrict. It will be endeavored impress upon the field staff to keep constant touch with the people of flood affected area local flood relief committee and visit the spot for all possible ways during the available measures.

for prompt action to the affected areas and smooth functioning of the activates of all the flood relief work under Dist.A.H.&Vety.Office,Majuli a central flood committee along with the Sub-Committee hereby constituted with the following officers, Staffs at overcome ensuing flood situation in the District.

The central committee will ensure the supplier feed/medicine/fodder/vaccine etc. to the fold affected areas priority basis as per required.

MASTER PLAN OF THE DISTRICT A.H.& VETY DEPTT. MAJULI ,FLOOD-2023:

The following work plan is lay out by the District A.H. & Vety.Officer, Majulii to combat the Flood situation in Majuli District. The following requisition in place to the District Majuli, Garamur for smooth and swift conduct of flood relief work.

1. FLOOD RELIEF AND RESQUE TEAM:

For each GP under Majuli and Ujani Majuli Dev. Block one Para Vety. Team is formed and this team is assigned to work for relief and rescue work during flood for each GP. They will keep contact with GP President/Secy. Ward Member, A.P.member & local flood relief Committee. All Vety. Officers are assigned as Sector Officer for 5 G.P.s to each sector for availability of Vety. Officer.

2. VETY.MEDICINE& VACCINES:-

Necessary Indent for requisition for flood medicines & vaccines is submitted at the Asstt. Director, Vety. Store, Guwahati 3, Joint Director, A.H. & Vety. Deptt. Institute of Veterinary Bio-Logicals. Khanapara, Guwahati-22. A small quantity of Medicines is keep buffer stock only.

3. The requirement Feed & Fodder per day as following feed 2kg/large animal per day 1 kg/small animal per day fodder 10 kg/large animal per day.

4. MACHINE BOAT:-

At least 4 Nos. of Machine Boat will be required for G.R relief distribution & rescue operation during the flood.

5. MINI TRUCK:-

Mini Trucks/Tractors will be required for carrying of feed and fodder to the Livestock sheltering placed during flood.

8. <u>CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR FLOOD PREPARDNESS FOR THE YEAR 2024-25 OF PWRD,</u> MAJULI DISTRICT TERRITORIAL ROAD DIVISION, GARAMUR, MAJULI

[There are two Sub-Divisions under this Division. Accordingly, CONTINGENCY PLAN is prepared Sub-Division wise]

8.1 Name of Sub-division:- PWRD, Majuli Territorial Road Sub-Division-I

This will cover the part of Pokajora GP, Rawnapar GP and Rangachahi GP.

Objectives:

- 1) To maintain road connectivity of all the major roads
- 2) To provide connectivity at least to transport food, medicine and other essential commodities and fodder through all roads
 - 3) To fit in the contingency plan during flood period

Challenges/limitations:

- 1) Non sanction of earlier flood damaged restoration work
- 2) Limited manpower and machineries
- 3) Limitation of financial resources

Thrust areas:

- 1) Identification of chainages where quick sand condition may develop (from earlier experience)
- 2) Tentative requirement of materials like sand, gunny bags, binding materials etc .for immediate restoration.

All departmental personnel will maintain two phone numbers to tide over lack of service of service providers. Keeping of two numbers are must for all Sectional Assistants. They will also keep power bank as a precautionary measure against major power failure.
