






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### MESSAGE

### **MESSAGE**

Assam has been ranked the most climate-vulnerable state in the country as per the district-level climate vulnerability assessment of India (CEEW, 2021). 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# **Executive Summary**



With increasing frequency, intensity and unpredictability, disaster risks are becoming more dynamic than ever before. This is leading to more men, women, girls, and boys getting affected and causing significant adverse impact on the economy due to infrastructure damages. According to a study by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, the state of Assam is ranked 15<sup>th</sup> among the Indian states and union territories in terms of total population, while it is ranked 8th in the composite disaster risk index among states and union territories in India. Specific to hazard index, Assam is ranked 1st in earthquake risk index while 2<sup>nd</sup> in flood risk index as per the study. Due to floods, which is the most visible risk, affected 39,50,065 (3.9 million) people annually while 4,58,041 (0.45 million) people annually took shelter in relief camps between 2012-20 in Assam. As per baseline data, Assam suffered an annual average economic loss of Rs.1186 crore per year between 2010-20.

Post-2015, international agreements such as the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR), Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and Paris Climate Agreement, and national initiatives such as the Prime Minister's Ten Point Agenda on DRR, infused a new energy and direction towards Disaster Risk Reduction, Sustainable Development and Climate Change Adaptation. However, there was still a need for the state of Assam to contextualize these frameworks to address the local disaster risks and integrate them in policy and practice. With this background, the Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) initiated the process to develop the Disaster Risk Reduction Roadmap for the state of Assam in 2018.

The DRR Roadmap for Assam aims at preventing new risks, reducing existing risks and managing residual risks thereby reducing losses and impacts of disasters in the state of Assam. Towards this aim, the Roadmap will accomplish the following objectives:

- Promote policy coherence relevant to disaster risk reduction, such as sustainable development, gender equity, poverty reduction and climate change, particularly with the SDGs and the Paris Climate Agreement, Prime Minister's Ten Point Agenda for DRR and National Disaster Management Plan of India, 2019.
- To establish realistic targets in alignment with Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR) for reduction of losses and impacts.
- To set realistic and feasible actions across short, medium, and longer timescales in alignment with

- the four priority areas of SFDRR for achieving the defined targets with a focus on most vulnerable groups including women, children, differentially able, families living below poverty line.
- Identify strategic opportunities for stakeholders (Government, Civil Society Organizations, Academic Institutions, Private Sector and UN Agencies) to coordinate and collaborate for disaster risk reduction actions.
- To establish a multi-stakeholder mechanism to follow-up, periodically assess and publicly report on progress.
- To estimate the average sector-wise losses and impacts due to disasters in the state of Assam from 2011 onwards based on available data.

The guiding principles for the Assam DRR Roadmap are:

- Building on existing governance system
- Integrated all hazard approach
- Multi-stakeholder orientation to DRR outcomes
- Coherence and Convergence
- Do No Harm
- Equity and Inclusion
- Resilient Development

Departments were guided to develop their Departmental Action Plans with short, medium, and long-term actions, supported by relevant stakeholders. These actions are then aligned to the four priorities under the SFDRR, which are:

- Priority 1: Understanding disaster risk
- Priority 2: Strengthening disaster risk governance to manage disaster risk
- Priority 3: Investing in disaster risk reduction for resilience
- Priority 4: Enhancing disaster preparedness for effective response, and to Build Back Better in recovery, rehabilitation, and reconstruction

The action plans are organized into thematic groups based on relevance of their functions and contribution to results. There are seven such thematic areas as follows:

1. Resilient Social Sector Services and Infrastructure: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on ensuring uninterrupted access to and resilient basic social services such as water, sanitation, food, health, and housing. Departments such as Health, Social Welfare, Public Health Engineering, Education (Elementary, Secondary, Higher), Panchayat & Rural Development, etc. are placed in this thematic group.

- 2. Resilient Critical Infrastructure: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on minimising disruption to the resources and structures which are critical for the society and economy to function optimally such as electricity, energy, telecommunication, industries, etc. Departments such as Power, PWD, Water Resources, Transport, Environment & Forest, etc. are placed in this thematic group.
- 3. Resilient Cities and Towns: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on amenities such as water, housing, roads, public spaces, etc. in cities and towns that can better handle disasters, absorb the impact of economic, environmental, and social hazards. Departments such as Guwahati Development, Urban Development and Cultural Affairs are placed in this thematic group.
- 4. Resilient Livelihoods: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on livelihoods that can quickly recover from disasters, absorb the impact of economic and environmental hazards, and promote people's well-being and prosperity. Departments such as Agriculture & Horticulture, Animal Husbandry & Veterinary, Fishery, Tourism, Irrigation, etc. are placed in this thematic group.
- 5. Resilient Emergency Response Systems: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on critical lifesaving response systems, early warning, search and rescue, first-aid, fire, and police services. A combined Action Plan for key Departments, ASDMA, DDMAs, NDMA, IMD, CWC, NESAC, UN Agencies, CSOs, Private Sector, etc. has been proposed in this thematic group.
- 6. Resilient Recovery and Building Back Better: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on post-disaster recovery measures to reduce vulnerability to future disasters, build resilience to address physical, social, environmental, and economic vulnerabilities and shocks. A combined Action Plan for Revenue & DM Dept. with support from Finance Dept., Academic Institutions, CSOs, etc. has been proposed in this thematic group.
- 7. Shared Resilience and Ensuring Results:
  In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on creating an enabling environment through legal amendments, new policies, directives, and financial commitments. In addition to identifying the available sources of funding for DRR activities proposed by the Departments in their Action

Plans, an Action Plan for the Finance Department has also been proposed in this thematic group. To ensure a dedicated resource flow for implementing the DRR Roadmap by stakeholder departments, the Assam Cabinet has approved the proposal for allocating 3 percent of State's budget (non-salary, non-wages, non-pension).

To support the stakeholders in the implementation of the DRR Roadmap, existing and proposed institutional mechanisms have been mapped and listed. Some of the existing institutional mechanisms are State Executive Committee of ASDMA, Departmental Apex Committees/ Statutory Bodies, UN Agencies, Civil Society Organisations, Private Sector Confederations, etc. The proposed institutional mechanisms are Implementation Support Unit, and State Platform for DRR including a technology platform. Additional Missions and Programs have been proposed to supplement implementation of action plans under various thematic areas. Some of the proposed Missions and Programs are:

- Livelihood Resilience Mission
- Urban Resilience Mission
- Chief Minister's Comprehensive School Safety and Security Program
- Chief Minister's Health and Nutrition System Resilience Program
- Chief Minister's Resilient Gaon Panchayat Program

In order to monitor the progress of the actions and evaluate the achievements of the Assam DRR Roadmap, specific Targets, Milestones and Common Measurable Indicators have been developed in line with the seven targets under the SFDRR, which are:

- 1. Reducing Disaster Mortality
- 2. Reducing People Affected
- 3. Reducing Economic Loss
- 4. Reducing Infrastructure Damage
- 5. Increase DRR Strategies
- 6. Increase Cooperation
- 7. Increase Access to Early Warning Systems & Disaster Risk Information

An online reporting platform will be developed in which Departments are expected to report against their Action Plans at pre-defined regular intervals. An Annual DRR Roadmap Status Report will be produced by the DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit. In order to ensure quality in the processes related to development of plans and proposals and later in the reports submitted by stakeholders, a checklist has been developed which will be used to evaluate, based on various parameters, the plans/proposals/reports related to the implementation of the DRR Roadmap.

# 1. Introduction

# 1.1 Background

Disaster risk landscape is changing globally with increasing frequency, intensity, and unpredictability, putting more and more men, women, girls, and boys exposed to harm. COVID-19 pandemic highlighted the emerging reality of diversified risks at a scale never seen before and as such tested the years of gains made to strengthen disaster resilience across the globe. It also highlighted the complex nature of interaction between different hazards requiring differential response.

Post 2015 framework agreements in the fields of disaster risk reduction, sustainable development and climate change have reiterated the importance and commitment towards an integrated approach promoting resilient and sustainable development. However, localization and translation of this understanding and commitment demands an agile, responsive, and flexible approach to policy and practice at all levels.

Assam is the 15<sup>th</sup> most populous state in the country while it is ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the composite disaster risk index among all states and union territories. Specific to hazard index, Assam is ranked 1<sup>st</sup> in earthquake risk index while 2<sup>nd</sup> in flood risk index as per the recent study conducted by Ministry of Home Affairs, Gol and UNDP<sup>1</sup>.

Because of the exposure to multiple hazards, and other drivers, and determinants of risk, Assam experiences varied scale of losses and impacts every year. Flood, which is the most visible risk, affected 39,50,065 (3.9 million) people annually while 4,58,041 (0.45 million) people annually took shelter in relief camps between 2012-20<sup>2</sup>. Floods result in significant economic losses and costs incurred to recover from the impact of floods. Baseline data shows that in the year 2019-20, economic losses were Rs. 3266 Crores, which was 0.87% of Assam's Gross State Domestic Product<sup>3</sup> (GSDP) for the same year, highest for a year in the 2011-20 decade.

Similarly, other hazards like erosion, thunderstorms, landslides, hailstorms, etc. have also rendered damages at varied scales. Projections related to climate change indicate an increase in extreme rainfall days, flooding in newer areas and extreme temperature events; all of which will contribute towards an upsurge in complexities in near future.

COVID-19 has further highlighted the significant public health dimension of the disaster risk profile of the state which has so far been dealing with small scale outbreaks of Dengue and JE/AES and other diseases. Reference to emerging risks have been made in many projections related to climate change/variability and environmental degradation. COVID-19 is the biggest and the most devastating example of multifaceted impact of disasters that becomes worse when hazards overlap with one another.

Assam has been a forerunner among provincial governments across the globe to adopt a localized and contextualized strategic approach towards achieving sustainable development goals. While concentrated efforts are being made towards implementing the local strategic approach to SDGs, it is equally important to look at the translation of strategic coherence for resilient development. There is a visible convergence of global agenda(s) offering historic opportunities to support vulnerable, fragile, and crisis-affected communities to achieve the 2030 Development Agenda and building resilience of such communities, livelihoods, and ecosystems to shocks and stresses. Same opportunity towards aligning global agendas (standards for action) and local knowledge can lead to strengthening of existing systems and state and local capacities to deal with disasters and climate change as well as regeneration of degraded ecosystems. This should help address the rising direct and indirect losses and impacts due to disasters and climatic extremes upon various development indicators to supplement and complement the efforts towards sustainable development.

# 1.2 Rationale for Assam Disaster Risk Reduction Roadmap

As losses and impacts related to disasters and climatic extremes continue to rise, the need for having a concerted and result oriented strategic approach is apparently non-negotiable. Assam has made substantive progress in overall disaster risk governance with investments to strengthen disaster management planning at state and district levels. However, the results of such plans, which are mostly done for an annual cycle, are difficult to measure in terms of reduction of losses and impacts.

Therefore, it is important to have a strategic framework to which the multi-sectoral plans can contribute. The Assam Disaster Risk Reduction Roadmap is envisaged to be one such state level strategic framework that delineates a common vision based on an understanding of disaster risk and backed by actions across different timescales, considering the short- and mid-term while simultaneously embracing a long-term perspective to prevent the creation of newer risks, reduce existing risks and recover from disasters and strengthen economic, social, health and environmental resilience.

The Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR), specifically 'Target E' of the framework, calls to

"substantially increase the number of countries with national and local disaster risk reduction strategies". While the DRR Roadmap is intended to specifically contribute towards achieving this target, it also contributes towards realization of multiple SDGs specifically SDG Goal 1 (Target 1.5), Goal 11 (Target 11.5 and 11b), and Goal 13 (Target 13.1).

Besides, the Assam DRR Roadmap is also envisaged as the strategic instrument to deliver on the Prime Minister's 10 Point Agenda which was outlined by honorable Prime

Minister of India during the Asian Ministerial Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction 2016, held at Delhi. The DRR Roadmap is a response to the resolutions adopted in the Delhi Declaration adopted during AMCDRR 2016 particularly the call to 'Pursue with a sense of urgency the paradigm shift from disaster management to disaster risk reduction<sup>4</sup>'. The following table outlines the relevance and contribution of the DRR Roadmap towards delivering on specific agendas:

PM's 10 Point Agenda⁵	Contribution and Relevance of the DRR Roadmap
<b>Agenda 1 -</b> All development sectors must imbibe the principles of disaster risk management.	The DRR Roadmap brings an umbrella of different themes to understand different risks and their impacts so far and accordingly guidelines setting up of action agenda to address the impact on specific sector and the lead department. The implementation of department wise action plans desegregated by timescales and relevance will enable holistic application of disaster risk management principles as per the priority areas identified under SFDRR by specific sectoral department.
Agenda 2 - Risk coverage must include all, starting from poor households to SMEs to multi-national corporations to nation states.	The DRR Roadmap has identified the existing risk insurance schemes relevant to specific actions in the departmental action plans which will assist the departments in prioritizing necessary steps to increase the risk insurance coverage. The DRR Roadmap has also listed actions to be taken towards exploring the risk insurance products for the weather and climate related disasters as well as for the critical infrastructure in the state.
<b>Agenda 3</b> - Women's leadership and greater involvement should be central to disaster risk management.	The process to develop DRR Roadmap involved intensive stakeholder consultation from up to the last mile (Revenue Circle level as the last administrative unit for R&DM department). Focus has been levied on participation of women and children and specific actions/recommendations raised by them have informed the various strategic actions across thematic and sub-thematic areas. Through an inclusive approach, the actions will enable involvement and leadership of women at different levels of the Roadmap as well as actions will contribute towards building their agency, capacity, and networks to achieve thematic priorities.
<b>Agenda 4</b> - Invest in risk mapping globally to improve global understanding of Nature and disaster risks.	The DRR Roadmap has emphasized actions towards studies and research to understand the nature and severity of current as well as future disaster risks. The Departments are going to undertake multi-hazard risk assessments and mapping of vulnerable areas and infrastructure in order to mitigate and prepare for the disaster risks. This will also contribute towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
<b>Agenda 5</b> - Leverage technology to enhance the efficiency of disaster risk management efforts.	While use of space-based technologies, GIS, use of UAV, etc. are already being explored and used in the state, the DRR Roadmap brings in specific sectoral needs and actions across timescales which can be achieved using technology. Technology driven low cost and nocost actions have been prioritized and thematic areas have been clearly identified where available and emerging technologies will be used. Data driven systems to track losses will be used. An integrated technology platform will play a major role in reporting, monitoring, and reviewing progress of the DRR Roadmap in the state.

<b>Agenda 6 -</b> Develop a network of universities to work on disaster-related issues.	Academia has been an important stakeholder during the consultative process at various levels. The Roadmap is also informed and benefitted from the work done by various academicians across thematic areas. Further, the Roadmap envisages a strong linkage between academic research and field practice in the field of DRR. The various thematic areas have identified DRR actions that will be undertaken by and with universities and higher education institutes from within and outside the country. Further the DRR Roadmap implementation will bring universities working in the state to contribute together to achieving relevant milestones.
<b>Agenda 7</b> - Utilize the opportunities provided by social media and mobile technologies for disaster risk reduction.	The DRR Roadmap also builds on the realization that social media and mobile technologies can play a very important role in risk communication and community engagement. Relevant actions have been included in the thematic action plans to ensure optimum utilization of social media resources and mobile technologies for achieving resilience.
<b>Agenda 8</b> - Build on local capacity and initiative to enhance disaster risk reduction.	The DRR Roadmap process ensured that local risks and priorities are captured from the perspective of multiple stakeholders from districts and up to Revenue Circle level. The process also ensured that the learning, experiences, and recommendations of duty bearers across the governance structure within the state is considered. Further, the strategic action plans across thematic and sub-thematic areas put focus on strengthening local capacities at district and sub-district level to strengthen resilience of communities and systems.

Assam has very rich experience of managing annual floods and has learnt lessons to improve flood management standards which are reflected in various initiatives. The Roadmap takes cognizance of the various areas of improvement highlighted through real-time assessments during floods. The Roadmap is expected to contribute towards a systemic reflection on how disasters and responses to them are looked at in a more predictable manner. It will look at establishing mechanisms to track real-time feedback for different kinds of disaster risk reduction initiatives implemented across sectors by departments and stakeholders. The existing systems to learn from floods will be further diversified while systems will be strengthened to ensure timely documentation of lessons learnt from other disasters through PDNA and other relevant processes. The stakeholder base is being opened with more space for Civil Society, PSUs, private sector, and academia to contribute across these agendas.
<b>Agenda 10</b> - Bring about greater cohesion in international response to disasters.	Through the DRR Roadmap, stakeholders will explore the global best practices and successful models in pre-disaster planning and preparedness for improved response. Commitments under the international agreements such as the SFDRR, SDGs and Paris Climate Agreement are considered for responding to disaster risks. Learning and exchanges will be encouraged to imbibe shared resilience.

# 1.3 Objectives

The DRR Roadmap for Assam aims at preventing new risks, reducing existing risks and managing residual risks thereby reducing losses and impacts of disasters in the state of Assam. Towards this aim, the Roadmap will accomplish the following objectives:

- Promote policy coherence relevant to disaster risk reduction, such as sustainable development, gender equity, poverty reduction and climate
- change, particularly with the SDGs and the Paris Climate Agreement, Prime Minister's Ten Point Agenda for DRR and National Disaster Management Plan of India, 2019.
- To establish realistic targets in alignment with Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR) for reduction of losses and impacts.
- To set realistic and feasible actions across short, medium, and longer timescales in alignment with

- the four priority areas of SFDRR for achieving the defined targets with a focus on most vulnerable groups including women, children, differentially able, families living below poverty line.
- Identify strategic opportunities for stakeholders (Government, Civil Society Organizations, Academic Institutions, Private Sector and UN Agencies) to coordinate and collaborate for disaster risk reduction actions.
- To establish a multi-stakeholder mechanism to follow-up, periodically assess and publicly report on progress.
- To estimate the average sector-wise losses and impacts due to disasters in the state of Assam from 2011 onwards based on available data.

Over and above, the Assam Disaster Risk Reduction Roadmap aspires to also address the following in a comprehensive and cohesive manner:

- To engage with and best utilize the existing governance mechanism and legal frameworks to manage the process of developing the DRR Roadmap and enabling its implementation.
- Build and improve understanding on disaster risks in the state and the various coping capacities at community and administrative levels to inform disaster risk reduction measures.
- To identify and collocate predictable and stable financial resources through multiple channels to ensure implementation of the roadmap.
- To leverage and build upon technical and institutional implementation capacities of various stakeholder departments and agencies.
- Transparent and rigorous follow-up and reviews to track progress and ensure real-time corrective measures.

# 1.4 Guiding Principles

**Building on existing governance system:** Assam has made considerable progress on disaster risk governance front with strong SDMA and DDMAs on the ground. The DRR Roadmap is built on the realization of strengths and areas of improvement in the overall risk governance domain and capitalizes on the routes and networks which have evolved over the years with governance systems at state, district, and sub-district levels. It recognizes the essence, values, and significance of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 for strengthening disaster resilience and aspires to build on institutional structure and mandate as envisioned under the Act. It also takes cognizance of the ambition and transformation envisioned under the National Disaster Management Plan, 2019.

- Integrated all hazard approach: The DRR Roadmap looks at disaster risks in total comprehension. While it emphasizes upon understanding multi-hazard risks in the context of the state, the action plan framework builds on an 'all-hazard' approach to address disaster resilience. Breaking silos, it pulls stakeholders to assess risks in their given context of functionality and relevance and adopts strategic action plans which will have co-benefits for all hazards and will enable systematic and systemic resilience.
- Multi-stakeholder orientation to outcomes: The DRR Roadmap acknowledges and capitalizes on the importance of shared resilience. It aspires to adopt a holistic view for dealing with existing 'silos' between various departments based on their mandates, types of technical expertise and responsibility for different hazards or climate risks. The thematic and sub-thematic organization of the Roadmap emphasizes upon collaborative multi-stakeholder and multisectoral approach bringing together experts and stakeholders from all relevant departments. agencies, and institutions throughout the process of developing the DRR strategy. The consultative process to develop the Roadmap involved wide range of stakeholders and experts including government line departments, technical agencies, Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs), Public Sector Undertakings (PSU), Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), local leaders, frontline workers, and representatives of at-risk communities.
- Coherence and Convergence: Mutual interdependence for reducing disaster risks is nonnegotiable and the Roadmap recognizes the same to promote and strengthen coherence across policy regimes governing development pathways. It aspires to learn from, contribute to, and amplify the efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). It also envisages to reinforce the climate change adaptation commitments under the State Action Plan on Climate Change and seeks to bring alignment with India's NDCs and the Paris Agreement which promotes an integrated approach to building resilience to disaster and climate risk in support of risk-informed development. Most importantly, the DRR Roadmap aspires to deliver on the Prime Minister's 10 Point Agenda on Disaster Risk Reduction.
- 'Do No Harm': 'Do No Harm' has been an important guiding principle in the development of the DRR Roadmap. The process and its output take due cognizance to avoid any negative effects of the interventions proposed on the rights of 'atrisk communities' and the relationship between different stakeholders at various levels including

- community functioning, local economy and livelihoods as well as environment to the best extent possible.
- **Equity and Inclusion:** The DRR Roadmap is informed by a baseline established on available data which enables better visualization of impact on geographic and sectoral pillars. The consultative process as well as the proposed action plans have been developed applying the lens of the most vulnerable communities and at-risk groups. Special focus has been given to address gender specific vulnerabilities interpreting associated risks and their prioritization of sectoral
- and inter-sectoral perspectives. Actions have been examined from the perspective of their relevance and implications towards various social and geographical vulnerabilities.
- Resilient Development: Resilience has been looked at as the core guiding principle, cross cutting all elements in the process. The four priority areas outlined in the Sendai Framework for DRR have been applied to approach resilience in the action planning carried out by all stakeholders which are segregated into different thematic pillars.

# 1.5 Process and methodology adopted for development of the DRR Roadmap

# Developing the Conceptual Framework

The concept and process for developing the DRR Roadmap has evolved through exposure visits and discussions with states which have already initiated such policy frameworks. Officials from Assam State Disaster Management Authority (ASDMA) went to understand a similar process undertaken in Bihar; held several rounds of discussions with stakeholders and prepared the conceptual framework with technical support from UNICEF.

# Preliminary Consultations with 16 Departments

Bilateral consultations were conducted with 16 Departments to review the initiatives taken for disaster management within the ambit of their respective disaster management plans and to discuss the DRR Roadmap process. The objective was to understand the current initiatives, the thinking of the department on making their work risk informed and discussions on the modalities of consultations to be taken up for developing the DRR Roadmap.

# Creating a Baseline for the DRR Roadmap

A process to develop a baseline against the 7 Targets of SFDRR was initiated based on available reports and data generated from different damage reports, memorandums, and other relevant sources. The baseline data has been analyzed to inform setting up of targets and action plans.

# **Consultative Process**

The process of consultation was divided into three levels to cover administrative and thematic inputs for the DRR Roadmap. The 1st level of consultations was organized at the Revenue Circle level in 154 Revenue Circles covering over 1000 participants and the 2nd level of consultations were organized at the district-level in 33 districts with over 400 participants for identifying the impact of disasters on various development outcomes and collect suggestions to reduce those impacts in line with the SFDRR priorities. The 3rd level of consultations was organized at the state-level on 7 thematic pillars with over 1000 participants which enabled state-wide reflection on specific subjects/themes aligned to the core responsibilities and functions of various line departments and stakeholders. 43 departments were actively involved in the preparation of the DRR action plans under different thematic areas. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, subsequent state-level consultations were organized through a mixed method including both virtual and offline modes of interactions where departments got the opportunity to understand the methodology and tools of preparation of the action plans. Accordingly, they were provided with time to develop their action plans, seek expert input (wherever necessary), improve, and submit the revised to ASDMA through proper channel. Subsequently, the final DRR Roadmap was placed before the cabinet for approval.

# Approval of the Conceptual Framework

The draft conceptual framework was presented to the State Executive Committee (SEC) of the Assam State Disaster Management Authority in its 37th meeting held on 8th October 2018.



# 1.6 Seven Thematic Groups

In order to better align with the governance structures and the various DRR functions, departmental action plans are clubbed into seven broad thematic areas. Each thematic group has action plans aligned with their DRR functions and identification of additional stakeholders for technical support and/or collaboration. Following are the thematic groups under the Assam DRR Roadmap:


- Resilient Social Sector Services and Infrastructure: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on ensuring uninterrupted access to and resilient basic social services such as water, sanitation, food, health, and housing.
- 2. Resilient Critical Infrastructure: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on minimising disruption to the resources and structures which are critical for the society and economy to function optimally such as electricity, energy, telecommunication, industries, etc.
- **3. Resilient Cities and Towns**: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on amenities such as water, housing, roads, public spaces, etc. in cities and towns that can better handle disasters, absorb the impact of economic, environmental, and social hazards.

- **4. Resilient Livelihoods**: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on livelihoods that can quickly recover from disasters, absorb the impact of economic and environmental hazards, and promote people's well-being and prosperity.
- **5. Resilient Emergency Response Systems**: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on critical life-saving response systems, early warning, search and rescue, first-aid, fire, emergency, and police services.
- 6. Resilient Recovery and 'Building Back Better': In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on post-disaster recovery measures to reduce vulnerability to future disasters, build resilience to address physical, social, environmental, and economic vulnerabilities and shocks.
- 7. Shared Resilience and Ensuring Results: In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on creating an enabling environment through legal amendments, new policies, directives, and financial commitments.

# 2. Baseline Data Analysis

# 2.1 Human Mortality due to Disasters


The graph below shows the number of human deaths due to flood, landslide, and thunderstorm in Assam since 2011. Due to these three hazards, there have been 114 deaths per year in the state between 2011 and 2020.

# 2.2 Road Accident-related Fatality & Injuries


The graph below shows the number of human accidents, injuries, and fatalities due to road accidents in Assam since 2015. Along with the deaths due to natural hazards such as floods, deaths due to road accidents are on a rising trend (data for the year 2020 is up to November).


### 2.3 People Affected by Disasters

The graph below shows the number of people affected by flood since 2012 (*data not available for 2011*), and by COVID-19 in 2020 (*as on 31st December 2020st)* in Assam. The number of people affected by floods is largely on a rising trend, with an **average of over 39.5 Lakhs (3.9 million) people affected per year**.






# 2.4 Districts Affected by Floods

The graph below shows the frequency of districts affected by floods since 2011. 20 districts were found affected by floods 8 or more times in the last 10 years. However, it should be noted that districts such as Majuli. South Salmara-Mankachar, Biswanath, Charaideo Hojai, which became separate in 2016, are also highly flood prone like the districts they were part of, i.e., Jorhat, Dhubri, Sonitpur, Sivasagar, and Nagaon, respectively.

# 2.5 Financial Loss due to Disasters

The graph below shows the estimated financial loss incurred by the Departments under the Government of Assam since 2011. The financial loss has been calculated based on the available reports and estimated cost of various infrastructures damaged by flood, landslide, erosion, thunderstorm, earthquake, fire, violence, etc. in Assam. The financial loss due to disasters is on an increasing trend with an average loss of Rs.1186 Crores per year.

# 2.6 Need for Disaster Damage & Loss Database

During the baseline data collection, it was observed that the availability of disaster related damage and loss data with the Departments was significantly better from 2014 onwards, compared to the previous years. However, the need for a uniform database management system was expressed by all the stakeholders involved in the Assam DRR Roadmap process.

# 3. Thematic Action Plans



This chapter covers the Departmental Action Plans organized under the seven thematic groups of the Assam DRR Roadmap. Each Departmental Action Plan is placed under one thematic group most relevant to the nature/scope of their work/mandate. One Department's name may also be present in the Action Plan of another Department as a key stakeholder to provide Technical Support or to collaborate for joint intervention.

In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on ensuring uninterrupted access to and resilient basic social services such as water, food, health, and housing.

### 3.5 Resilient Preparedness for Response

In this theme, the stakeholders will focus on critical lifesaving response systems, early warning, search and rescue, first-aid, fire, emergency, and police services.

India's National Disaster Management Plan of 2019 has adopted the inter-governmental panel recommended definition for preparedness and response where response is defined as 'Actions taken directly before, during or immediately after a disaster in order to save lives, reduce health impacts, ensure public safety and meet the basic subsistence needs of the people affected' and preparedness is defined as 'The knowledge and capacities developed by governments, response and recovery organizations, communities and individuals to effectively anticipate, respond to and recover from the impacts of likely, imminent or current disasters.'213 In the given context of both these concepts, Assam has its own unique positioning. Assam over the years has learnt lessons for strengthening its preparedness systems and capacities for responding to recurrent floods. These lessons have contributed towards injecting timely reviews, pre-positioning of human and material resources, early warning systems, evacuation and emergency shelter mechanisms, relief administration, and inter departmental coordination etc.

As a continuum of improvement, the state aspires to apply development programing lens to emergency preparedness and response thereby focusing on quality, equity, inclusion and gender transformation, timeliness, and adequacy of response in the context of flood. This also relates to continuously improving systems and capacities to deliver equally effective response for other forms of shocks and stresses that they state is already/possibly get exposed to. Particularly, the state recognizes that 'Effective, equitable and participatory emergency response is not feasible without understanding and responding to the specific needs, priorities and capacities of women, girls, men and boys in different age groups<sup>214</sup>; people with disabilities, people with different barriers (e.g. cultural, linguistic, legal), older persons, indigenous communities, migrants and others, their organizations and networks<sup>215</sup>.' which itself indicates a paradigm shift in the approach to preparedness for response.

The National Disaster Management Plan, 2019 also identifies 21 major emergency functions and identified roles and responsibilities for different ministries, departments, and agencies at central and state levels to carry out these functions. These functions include- Communication; Cultural Heritage Sites, their Precincts and Museums' Protection and Preservation; Data Collection and Management; Disposal

of animal carcasses; Drinking Water/ Dewatering Pumps/ Sanitation Facilities; Early Warning, Maps, Satellite inputs, Information Dissemination: Evacuation of People and Animals; Fodder for livestock in scarcity-hit areas; Food and Essential Supplies; Fuel; Housing and Temporary Shelters; Management of the dead people: Media Relations: Medical care; Power; Public Health; Rehabilitation and Ensuring Safety of Livestock and other Animals, Veterinary Care: Relief Employment: Relief Logistics and Supply Chain Management; Search and Rescue of People and Animals; and Transportation. Through this Roadmap, the state of Assam envisions to address the existing and emerging priorities across and within these emergency functions to improve the quality, effectiveness, and efficiency of response through robust and improved preparedness at multiple levels. The departmental roadmaps defined in different thematic pillars (particularly those corresponding to priority four of the SFDRR under each departmental action plan) will contribute towards augmenting system wide preparedness. In this pillar, core emergency response functions and the actions at their level will be emphasized (which are not covered in departmental action plans) will be emphasized. The structuring of this pillar of the roadmap is guided by the following principles to augment preparedness for response capacities in the state:

- Building on State's primary responsibility for response - The National Disaster Management Act, 2005 and National Disaster Management Plan 2019 clearly outlines the responsibility of the Centre and the state in preparedness and response. The roadmap envisages building on and strengthening capacities of stakeholders to deliver effective, inclusive, gender sensitive, adequate and dynamic response for different anticipated and even unanticipated scenarios
- Empowering local (district, sub-division, circle/ block, Gaon Panchayat/Village) level decision makers - The DRR Roadmap acknowledges that response to any disaster is local in the outset. For a state as diverse as Assam, the mechanisms, and systems for different scale of emergencies is also very diverse (e.g., Panchayats Vs. Village Councils in 6<sup>th</sup> schedule areas) Hence, continuous stimulus and injects flown to different levels of decision makers and responders on critical and risk informed decision making will define the efficiency, inclusivity, and adequacy of response. The roadmap promotes strategic interventions across thematic areas to empower local decision making and for preparedness and readiness to respond as well, the focus will be central.

- Respecting geo-spatial, demographic, socioeconomic, socio-cultural, and other diversities to adopt 'whole of society engagement' - The state's scenario and experience of disasters vary according to different existing diversities. The roadmap acknowledges and respects the role these diversities play in defining the nature and extent of preparedness and aspires to promote 'whole of society engagement' where specific needs of men, women, boys, girls, elderly, disabled, economically poor in the different layers of social stratification, people representing different religions, tribes, castes etc living with different identities at different **geographical locations** within the state are included, consulted, involved and their ownership towards preparedness for response is encouraged
- Scenario driven capability-based preparedness As scenarios following the same hazard are often different in different locations within the state owing to different elements of exposure, vulnerabilities and coping capacities, the roadmap endorses and promotes the idea of defining different scenarios for emergencies and augment preparedness accordingly. Be it through the process of District Disaster Management
- Plans, Hazard Specific Contingency Plans (such as flood contingency plans) Gaon Panchayat/Village level disaster management plans, the process to define scenarios (primary and secondary impacts learning lessons from flood and COVID-19) will be promoted and accordingly investments will be directed to address the differential scenarios. Mock drills so designed will be staged to different scenarios and participation of the different stakeholders including the population at risk will be ensured to test efficacy and effectiveness of plans and clarity of action at different levels
- Ensuring coordinated actions in preparedness and response The Roadmap acknowledges the role of diverse stakeholders in preparedness and response. It also recognizes that emergency coordination mechanism becomes functional in time if preparedness coordination is effectively managed. Therefore, the roadmap promotes intra and inter emergency function coordination involving government, non-government, private and social groups/institutions who have/play a role in response. The SDMAs, DDMAs, CDMCs and VLCDMCs will act as platforms for different levels of preparedness coordination in this regard.

### 3.6 Resilient Recovery and Building Back Better

Assam is a uniquely placed state in the whole country where disaster recovery is also seen as a yearly process. As a result of annual floods which result in huge losses and impacts, the recovery is never seen as complete or full and often tagged as ongoing at family, community or systems level. Often the gaps in recovery lead to widening of development deficiencies increasing challenges in the efforts to reduce them. Different sectors experience the annual recovery phenomenon at different levels. Besides this, Assam has other potent hazards which can result in massive losses and impacts and will require a holistic recovery planning and approach. Therefore, an approach that clearly estimates, predicts, channelizes, and executes all available options to ensure optimum utilization for aligning with the principle of 'Building Back Better' is of outmost importance for envisioning a disaster resilient Assam.

The DRR Roadmap envisages defining a broader pathway that can ease the process towards recovery from recurrent as well as latent hazards more predictable, efficient and equity driven. Whereas, the 15th Finance Commission Report recommends 30% of the State Disaster Risk Management Fund (under SDRF) to be allocated for 'Recovery and Reconstruction' and the draft 'National Guidelines for Recovery and Reconstruction' is being shared for inputs from stakeholders, this DRR Roadmap adopts the definition of recovery as outlined in the draft guidelines as "comprehensive process of socioeconomic interventions and physical reconstruction through which households and communities rebuild their assets, restore their livelihoods and strengthen their capacities to manage the impacts of a future disaster<sup>217</sup>". For the recovery pathway to be effective, the DRR Roadmap establishes the direction within which the state will strive towards strengthening systems and capacities for meaningfully, effectively, and efficiently addressing recurrent and possible disaster recovery needs.

# 3.6.1 Key Guiding Principles for policy and planning pertaining to resilient recovery

This DRR Roadmap recommends the following principles to be adopted which is in alignment with the draft national guideline and addresses the state specific scenario and needs:

**1. Differential approach for specific situations** - This DRR Roadmap underscores the importance of taking a differential disaster recovery approach

for different situations. Particularly, the differential approach will consider evolving contextualized procedures to address annual recovery needs created by seasonal hazards such as floods and those anticipated needs that may emerge in the face of a latent mega disaster such as earthquake. The differential approach will allow optimum utilization of resources and effective addressal of needs.

- 2. Building Back Better As emphasized in the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and adopted in the approach to National Disaster Management Plan, 2019, this DRR Roadmap envisages that in all practical ways possible, the approach to disaster recovery in Assam after any disaster will emphasize upon resilience of systems and communities in the state by considering disaster risks (existing and possible) into the restoration of physical infrastructure and governmental and societal systems; revitalization of livelihoods, state's economy, and the environment<sup>218</sup>.
- 3. Transferring Resources to affected people
  The 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission clearly outlines the importance of transferring resources to people at risk. Transferring resources to people at risk only helps them cope with losses at hand but also provides them with choices to augment their resilience by investing in different elements of risk reduction. This will also contribute towards improving their overall wellbeing and dealing with some of the existing deprivations such as poverty, malnutrition, vulnerable livelihoods etc. Therefore, all types of disaster recovery programs shall imbibe this principle in design and implementation.
- 4. Addressing Geo-Spatial Diversities Assam is a state with different levels of geo-spatial diversities and the overall human development is assessed based on those. The latest Human Development Report of the state which was released in 2014 classified different development blocks according to geo-spatial diversities which include general blocks, multi-diversity blocks, border blocks, hilly blocks, flood affected blocks and char blocks<sup>219</sup>. While these diversities overlap in certain contexts, any disaster recovery program must consider these diversities for effective planning, execution, and results.

- 5. Shared responsibilities In order for any disaster recovery program to work in the state of Assam, it must be designed and built by sharing responsibilities. Recovery is accepted as one of the most complex steps in disaster management because it increases stakeholder base. As experiences with floods in Assam; other than government departments; a host of NGOs, private sector companies, associations and networks, local platforms, individuals in different roles play an important role in supporting communities recover from the losses and impacts. It is important that these efforts are well planned, coordinated and shared for reducing duplication, increasing scope, speed, and efficiency of recovery.
- 6. Social Inclusion and equity driven process -As geo-spatial diversities play a major role, so do the socio-cultural diversities in all aspects of the state's existence and development. Assam has very rich socio-cultural mix of different groups. It is important for any disaster recovery program to consider the socio-cultural diversity by assessing the differential impact on different social groups and by ensuring that diverse social groups particularly those with multidimensional vulnerability are involved in all phases including assessment, design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the recovery programs. Not only their concerns and perspectives, but also their local knowledge and experiences shall form a basis for planning. It is also important to consider the demographic dividends in the process and ensure that children and young people, women, persons with disability, elderly, people with chronic diseases, people living with

- poverty are consulted and involved in all stages by design.
- 7. Gender Transformation Applying gender transformation lens is crucial for types of policy and program to achieve sustainable development. This DRR Roadmap envisages that any recovery policy or program be designed as gender transformative addressing gender concerns in a transformative manner.
- **8. Accountability to affected population** The principle of accountability to affected population implies use of power (such as resources for recovery, decision making, etc.) by government agencies and other stakeholders at different levels by taking account of, giving account to, and being held to account by the people<sup>220</sup> in all phases including assessment, design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the recovery programs. This would essentially mean inclusive governance, transparency in the process, vibrant feedback and compliant mechanisms and participation of affected population across phases.
- 9. Optimum utilization of available resources -Any disaster recovery program will be guided by the principle of optimum utilization of available and possible resources for recovery. This would mean structured and convergent programs with national and state flagship programs across sectors, channelizing other financials windows SDRF and NDRF (if applicable), external aid, etc. to meet the gaps at different levels in different sectors.

### 3.7 Shared Resilience & Ensuring Results

The National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP) 2019 clearly outlines the roles of various stakeholders in implementing the disaster risk reduction priorities for the country in alignment with the global frameworks. The concept of shared resilience for Assam Disaster Risk Reduction endorses the idea of shared responsibilities for financing disaster resilience and sustainable development. This concept builds on the legal framework provided under the National Disaster Management Act, 2005 and covers the following broad windows for accessing financial resources for implementing the DRR Roadmap intervention:

Window 1	Legal provisions under specific sections of the National Disaster Management Act that provide for financing risk reduction priorities and actions and as outlined in the National Disaster Management Plan (allocation under specific plans/instruments)

## Window 2 Provisions made as per the recommendation of the 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission (FC-XV), SDRMF, NDRMF

The 15<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission building on the learning and progress made in the disaster management domain has presented a very robust Roadmap for disaster management financing. The 15<sup>th</sup> FC Report<sup>222</sup> identified two broad weaknesses of the existing disaster risk financing mechanisms tagged as 'contingent liabilities<sup>223</sup>'. One, the existing focus on 'meeting' the contingent liabilities and not 'reducing' them. Second, lack of 'multiple instruments and funding windows' to cater to increased risk exposure and possibility of increased 'contingent liabilities. Therefore, the 15<sup>th</sup> FC recommended the constitution of State Disaster Risk Management Fund and National Disaster Risk Management Fund.

### **State Disaster Risk Management Fund:**

The 15<sup>th</sup> FC recommended that total State allocation for SDRMF should be divided into State Disaster Response Fund and State Disaster Mitigation Fund. As per the recommendation, the SDRF should be allocated 80% of the total SDRMF, while the SDMF should be allocated remaining 20%. Within the SDRF allocation of 80%, should comprise of three sub-allocations including Response and Relief (40%), Recovery and Reconstruction (30%) and Preparedness and Capacity-building (10%). The report also establishes that funding windows of SDRF and SDMF are not inter-changeable; however, flexibility for re-allocation within the three sub-allocations under SDRF is possible. The allocation for Assam as per the 15<sup>th</sup> FC report are as follows:

The State Disaster Mitigation Fund which will be 20% of the above allocation and the Capacity Building Sub-Allocation which is 10% of State Disaster Response Fund will be the primary source of financing the interventions as envisaged in the DRR Roadmap. However, this will include only those interventions which will be aligned to subsequent guidelines to be issued by Gol. Particularly, those interventions outlined in this DRR Roadmap which are 'local level and community-based interventions which reduce risks and promote environment-friendly settlements and livelihood practices' will be channelized through this window for accessing funding following due procedure.

### **National Disaster Risk Management Fund:**

The National Disaster Risk Management Fund is recommended to be the national disaster reserve to supplement the SDRF. The allocation under National Disaster Risk Management Fund is suggested to be in line with the State Disaster Risk Management Fund. Adhering to the guidelines so received from Gol, specific interventions under this DRR Roadmap will be converted to proposals for access the NDMF Funding window. The entire process will be guided by the process and steps prescribed in the central guidelines and will only be conceived if the said intervention is over and above the SDMF but still aligns with the NDMF guidelines.

Window 3	Risk Informing regular government schemes and programs
	Various Government departments implement their sectoral/thematic programs including in areas exposed to different disaster risks. The concept of risk informing regular government programs builds on the rationale that regular programs and their envisaged results are impacted by disasters and hence they must adopt risks informed adaptive programing measures to reduce such impacts.
	Therefore, within the agreed budget lines and existing financial frameworks, interventions, to reduce disruption or damage to departmental program results, should be based on a program specific risks and impact analysis.
Description	The existing examples include 'Comprehensive School Safety and Security Program' by Education Department, 'Climate Change and Health' related programs by Health Department, 'Flood Resilient Crop Promotion' Programs by Agriculture Department etc. The basic principle of risk informing regular departmental program lies in the fact that the disaster risk reduction interventions become a part of core programing plan and are not treated as special/separate disaster risk reduction programs
	Thus, those actions as outlined in this DRR Roadmap which are possible within the ambit of the existing schemes/funding frameworks, shall be integrated as part of Program Implementation Plans for state government schemes/programs. Each department is required to mark such activities in their departmental roadmap which will form part of their annual plan of action/Program Implementation Plan
Window 4	Flexi Funds under Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs) in the context of Assam
Description	The flexi -funds provide for a sustained source of funding for mitigation activities which are aligned to the objectives of the Centrally SS(s) under which they are allocated. However, it is one-dimensional funding window which can only be used for intervention specific to one sector/department's function and shall not be used for any activity which is outside the ambit of the programme.  As per Office Memorandum issued by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, the NITI Aayog has issued instructions for rationalization of Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSSs), vide OM No. O11013/02/2015-CSS & CMC dated August 17, 2016, through which the flexi funds available under CSSs have been increased to 25% for States, and 30% for UTs of their overall annual allocation. One of the three objectives stated in the OM regarding use of Flexi Fund refers 'To undertake mitigation/ restoration activities in case of natural calamities, or to satisfy local requirements in areas affected by internal security disturbances <sup>225</sup> .  However, the 15 <sup>th</sup> Finance Commission report puts to record that Flexi Funds are not actually used for mitigation activities <sup>226</sup> . It also clearly outlines that 'large scale interventions such as construction of coastal walls, flood embankments, etc.' which are highly resource intensive 'should be pursued through regular development schemes and not from the mitigation fund <sup>227</sup> .  In the above context, specific interventions as outlined in this DRR Roadmap will be pursued by respective departments to categorize and include under specific window including appropriate use of the flexi fund to implement relevant interventions which are linked to the objectives of the specific CSSs.

Window 5	Externally Aided Projects from Multi-lateral and Bilateral donors
	Assam has been working in partnership with Multi-Lateral and Bi-Lateral Donors to raise funding for specific development as well as disaster risk reduction initiatives. Historically, the World Bank and Asian Development bank have provided funds/loans to infrastructure (mainly structural) intervention related to flood risk management such as embankments. Funds have also been mobilized to support targeted non-structural activities for specific geographic locations. Government of India agencies including Ministry of Development of Northeast Region (MoDoNER), Northeastern Council (NEC) have also been supporting projects covering structural and non-structural mitigation activities by specific departments/agencies. UN Agencies particularly UNICEF and UNDP have also been working with the state government on various elements of disaster risk reduction/management.
Description	For specific funding needs of this DRR Roadmap which require funding from Multi-Lateral Donors such as the World Bank and ADB, following due process of approval specific projects will be developed and processed through established channel in due consultation with Gol. Specific proposals will be developed and channeled through the Planning Department to access funding with specific Gol agencies such as MoDONER and NEC. Existing established processes will be followed. The UN Agencies particularly UNICEF and UNDP will be part of the technical support team and shall be included as technical partners to support implementation of specific interventions by respective departments with whom they have an agreed work-plan.
	Besides the above arrangement, other potential donors and partners will be identified based on requirement to raise funding for implementation of the DRR Roadmap following due procedure. In order to facilitate the above, a DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit will be established at the ASDMA.
Window 6	Mobilizing investment from Private Sector including use of the CSR grants as applicable
Description	Even though private sector plays an important role in response and recovery related actions in the context of flood in the state. However, the potential role of private sector for disaster risk reduction has largely remained underexplored. Schedule VII of the Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules 2014 relating to corporate social responsibility states that companies may provide funds for the Prime Minister's Relief Fund or "any other fund set up by the Union Government or the State Governments for socio-economic development and relief".
	The DRR Roadmap implementation will include mapping and tapping of such private sector players both within and outside the state to support and supplement implementation of strategic interventions. The DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit will act as a facilitation centre linking appropriate partners/stakeholders in this regard
Window 7	Insurance and Risk Pooling
Description	As a part of strategy to manage 'residual risk' and based on development at the national level towards development risk insurance packages for different category of demands/needs, the interventions beyond the scope of windows defined above will be mapped for insurance and risk pooling. As recommended in the 15 <sup>th</sup> FC report and depending upon further developments at Gol level specific interventions will be linked.
Window 8	Crowd Funding and others
Description	This is an emerging and very potent area of funding not only response and recovery but resilience building interventions. In coordination with Government of India, efforts will be made to establish a standard crowd-funding platform for raising funds through the Roadmap Implementation Support Unit. However, as outlined in the 15 <sup>th</sup> FC report, Government of Assam may consider outsourcing expertise towards Identifying the right time for crowd funding, setting up secure payment gateways and ensuring accountability and transparency with due guidelines developed in coordination with Gol.

## 4. Implementing the Assam DRR Roadmap



#### 4.1 Institutional Mechanism

The Disaster Risk Reduction Roadmap for Assam is envisaged as the guiding policy framework to guide the state's ambition of becoming disaster resilient in a changing climate by preventing new risks, reducing existing risks and managing residual risks. The implementation of the DRR Roadmap strategic interventions is the responsibility of the stakeholders as mapped in the document. To support these stakeholders in implementation of the DRR Roadmap, existing and proposed institutional mechanisms and their responsibilities are mentioned below:

#### **4.2 Implementation Modality**

This Roadmap places emphasis on being ambitious and thus endorses a multi-vehicle implementation modality in a complex stakeholder engagement environment. The sectoral/departmental action plans as mapped in the **DRR Roadmap will be implemented through a mix of the following approaches**:

- State level Missions Based on the themes proposed, state level missions will be developed in line with mission structures used for developing and implementing national missions. Missions will be developed in the case of a whole thematic pillar within one umbrella framework aligned with existing systems and allocations. Each mission will be implemented through an existing structure of schemes/SPVs with additional financial and human resource impetus. The DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit will take a lead in designing the Mission structures and respective departments/agencies will process the approval according to established protocols. Initially, it is proposed to develop the following state level missions:
  - Livelihood resilience mission
  - Urban resilience mission

Further, the DRR Roadmap Advisory Committee in consultation with the State Platform for DRR may propose undertaking missions around other thematic pillars as per scope, feasibility and need.

• State Level Programs - This approach will be adopted in case of thematic pillars, where one mission will not be adequate to address the thematic diversities of a particular thematic pillar. The Programs will be implemented by a specific department in collaboration with relevant stakeholders. Each Program will have specific milestones, indicators and targets and will leverage multiple funding windows to cover different aspects of the program implementation

cost. Initially, the following state level programs are being proposed:

- Chief Minister's Comprehensive School Safety and Security Program
- Chief Minister's Health and Nutrition System Resilience Program
- Chief Minister's Resilient Gaon Panchayat Program
- Chief Minister's Multi-Hazard Preparedness Program (This will include Emergency Preparedness Strengthening Program covering facilitation hassle-free access to cash assistance and other response support, community engagement and feedback for accountability)
- Chief Minister's special protection program for population at risk
- Chief Minister's Multi-Purpose Emergency Shelter Strengthening Program
- Chief Minister's WASH resilience Program

Further, the DRR Roadmap Advisory Committee in consultation with the State Platform for DRR may propose other programs based on need, progress of DRR Roadmap interventions, progress in accessing financial windows, etc.

Specific Projects (geographical and thematic)
Besides the above two, special projects will be another implementation modality which will be demand driven based on the requirements from specific stakeholders as well as available and emerging financing opportunities such as those needed to access SDMF or externally aided funding opportunities. This modality will be the most used and available option facilitated by the Roadmap Implementation-cum-technical support Unit under the guidance of the advisory committee.

# 5. Measuring Results - Monitoring & Evaluation of the DRR Roadmap



The success of the DRR Roadmap lies in the way it contributes towards the goal and objectives for which it is being developed. This is a complex function particularly because of the multi-sectorality and interdependence of results. However, the DRR Roadmap envisages a simplified process for tracking progress towards intended results. The process will enable reporting and capturing information in one platform, multi-stage verification and quality control as per existing structures and cumulative analysis in real-time to understand progress and take action towards course correction/ adaptation as needed. The Roadmap monitoring will include targets, milestones, and Common Measurable Indicators (CMIs) drawn for each thematic pillar as established in the document. These are detailed in the following table:

#### 5.2 Online Reporting Process, Platform and Tools

Sticking to the idea of providing a single window simplified process of reporting, the DRR Roadmap Implementation Unit will work towards designing and developing an IT-based online platform enabling access to all concerned stakeholders for reporting progress on DRR Roadmap implementation. This will be hosted at ASDMA and managed by the DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit. The reporting will have the following components:

 Reporting against targets, milestones, and Common Measurable Indicators (CMIs) - As the DRR Roadmap has defined targets, milestones and common measurable indicators, the reporting platform will have a component where responsible stakeholders will be reporting against these. The reporting will be mostly quantitative with certain qualitative elements (as applicable) and will relate to 'contributions' or 'attributions' by the stakeholders leading towards achieving the targets, milestones, and indicators. The submission will be visualized through a dashboard which will portray progress with infographics It is proposed that the reporting against this will be kept on a yearly basis for enabling stakeholders to come up with substantial submission that can resemble progress towards actual intended results. Based on annual submissions, the **Annual DRR Roadmap Status Report** will be produced by the DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit. This report will also form the basis of annual reviews by different responsible institutions and committees as outlined in the previous chapter. This will also be the main reference for strategic discussion and decision during the annual conventions of the State DRR Platform.

Reporting progress against planned interventions - This is proposed to be the regular way of reporting for the DRR Roadmap where stakeholders will be updating on progress against planned interventions. There will be two options for this form reporting. Firstly, there will be a mandatory bi-annual reporting by all stakeholders and secondly there will be 'need based and optional' reporting where stakeholders

based on progress achieved with any significant development related to the planned intervention can voluntarily opt to report. Besides, there will also be need based reporting requirements which will be workflowed to a particular department/ agency by the DRR Roadmap Implementation Support Unit to meet any urgent donor ask, compliance requirements or requirements from the State Government or Government of India depending upon the funding window accessed for implementing the intervention.

The DRR Roadmap Advisory Committee may propose, based on need and in consultation with responsible stakeholders, changes in the reporting mechanism as stated above. However, before recommending such changes, a rationale, and a majority (1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the reporting stakeholders registered for reporting) will be required so as to ensure endorsement of those who will be responsible for reporting.

#### 5.2.1 Disaster Risk Reduction Technology Platform

The implementation of the DRR Roadmap shall be monitored through a very robust reporting system which will enable access to all concerned stakeholders in the form of a technology platform. The reporting will have both quantitative and qualitative elements designed to track the progress made in accomplishing the DRR Roadmap targets, milestones and indicators. On the basis of the submission made by all concerned stakeholders an Annual DRR Roadmap status report will be produced by the DRR Roadmap Implementation Unit and approved by the State platform for DRR. Apart from being a digital monitoring system on the implementation of the roadmap. the technology platform will also provide the opportunity for learning on disasters, networking and managing & disseminating important information. Using this platform, holistic and effective stakeholder engagement can be ensured which is of paramount importance on the path of achieving shared resilience.

#### **Features of the Technology Platform**

The Technology Platform shall contain the following features:

• Implementation Dashboard: The Technology Platform will contain a Dashboard on major DRR actions and highlights of the milestones achieved under each phase of the disaster governance cycle (Preparedness, Response, Rehabilitation, Recovery etc) under each thematic pillar(as envisaged in the DRR Roadmap). It will help identify the performance of each department against different set of indicators. The success

- on each measurable indicator will be displayed thematic wise using different graphical visualizations.
- Performance Dashboard: A Window which shows the performance of the various districts, revenue circle and departments on critical disaster vulnerability parameters defining the nature of the success of the DRR Roadmap implementation. It will also identify the parameters which require attention and intervention.
- Learning Dashboard: A Window which will provide opportunities of learning for policy makers, DRR professionals, scholars, students and civil society members. The DRR Roadmap Implementation Unit headed by the Chief Executive Officer-ASDMA may design the learning strategy with the involvement of global universities
- Networking Platform: A Digital Networking system of stakeholders within the state who can consult on DRR Roadmap implementation on a regular basis.
- Early Warning and Reporting Integration: The Technology Platform will also integrate ASDMA's early warning information dissemination, Flood Reporting and Information Management System.
- Citizen Centric Services Dashboard: There
  may also be provisions of citizen centric services
  within the technology platform so that policy
  makers can understand real time problems by
  involving the community in decision making.

#### 5.3 Evaluation of the Roadmap

The Assam DRR Roadmap 2030 will be evaluated twice during the entire implementation period; once as a midterm review in the year 2027 and the other in the year 2031. The evaluation has to be carried out by a competent technical agency who will assess the success of the roadmap and provide programmatic and operational solutions to ASDMA. The process and methodology of evaluation will be decided with the active involvement of the DRR Roadmap Implementation Unit and thematic leads from Assam State Disaster Management Authority. The observations and findings from the midterm evaluation report will be used to upgrade implementation strategies and action plan thereby defining the pathways for the future course of action within the scope of the roadmap. The end term evaluation report will be used by ASDMA to design a future policy document which will act as a successor of the present roadmap with newer & refined perspectives. ASDMA under the guidance of SEC will prepare a detailed midterm and end term evaluation strategies with the involvement of the DDR Roadmap implementation-cum-technical support stakeholders from different sectors.

#### **5.4 Quality Assurance Checklist**

In order to ensure quality in the processes related to development of plans and proposals and later in the reports submitted by stakeholders, the following checklist will be used to ensure quality by grading plans/proposals/reports related to the implementation of the DRR Roadmap. The checklist has been designed as universally applicable to all themes and stakeholders:
